## Will Decide Grade 13 Future Soon

TORONTO—Ontario Education Minister William Davis said last week the broad outlines of possible general and advanced courses in the proposed Grade 13 curriculum will be ready by Jan. 1.

The minister said in a memorandum to school officials that the future of Grade 13 in the Ontario school system should be decided this year.

He said the province's appointed Grade 13 implementation committee will begin dis-

...cussing with university officers, teachers organizations and other interested bodies the practicality of the proposed two-level Grade 13. Proposals made over the last 16 months by two government-appointed committees called for the number of subjects required of each student in Grade 13 to be reduced from nine to four — two of the subjects being taken at the advanced level and two at a less-intensive general level. He said he hoped the province's universities will give their opinions on the proposed new course and its effect on university admission requirements early next year.

## Central A. I. Unit Holstein Sale Averages \$680 For 49 Head

MAPLE — The 15th Annual "Show Window" Holstein sale of animals sired by bulls in the Central Ontario Cattle Breeding Association Unit at Maple, was held at Oakville October 18 with 49 head bringing a total of \$33,320 for an average of \$680 each. This is the highest average ever made in Canada at an A. I. Unit sale.

Top price was \$2,000 and 6 head sold for at least \$1,000. Thirty-five of the forty-nine head were sold for export, these going to Argentina, Chile, Italy and the U.S.A.

The top price of \$2,000 was paid by C. M. Bottema, Indiana, for a three-month-old bull calf, Oak Ridges Reflection Lancer. This bull is out of a dam classified "Excellent" and with a yearly record of 27,196 lbs. of milk, and his sire is the noted "Excellent" and Superior Type sire, Roeland Reflection Sovereign.

The second highest price of the sale, and the top figure for a bred heifer was paid to R. D. Graham, Erin, for Grahaven Bonnet. This was \$1,300 which amount was received from Cooperation Agropecuaria de Capilla del Senor, Buenos Aires. This organization also paid \$1,050 to J. G. Brethel, Tottenham, for a daughter of the Class "Extra" sire, Rosafle Citation R. In addition they paid \$1,025 to W. Bruce Snider for a Very Good daughter of the Excellent sire, Thornlea Texal Supreme, who also sired the Graham heifer.

One male brought \$2,000; 11 milking females averaged \$718 each and thirty-seven bred heifers \$632 each.

### Chiropractic Viewpoint

#### SINUS TROUBLE

The sinuses are cavities located in the bones of the face and head. Normally they are filled with air, and among their functions is to lighten the weight of the skull and give resonance to the voice. Each one is lined with a membrane which secretes mucus. The sinus must have a way to drain this mucus.

If the sinuses should become congested breathing is difficult and the resulting pressure causes discomfort and pain.

By removing the irritation from the pathways of the sympathetic nervous system the chiropractor attempts to normalize the functioning of the sinuses. Often after a few chiropractic adjustments there is a profuse nasal discharge indicating a healthy drainage of the sinus is taking place. Later the inflammation of musc membrane subsides.
