World Vision Korean Orphanage Choir

On Monday, Oct. 18th, twenty-five members of the Glee Club travelled to Varsity Stadium to attend the Korean Choir's Concert.

The choir consists of twenty-five girls, thirteen boys and 8 chaperones. The conductor is Mr. Joe Hoon Paik, the accompanist is Chihye Paik, and Hyo Jook Paik is the assistant director.

This is the choir's third World Tour. The choir has a repertoire of two hundred Hymns, Spirituals, Korean Folk Songs, Children's Songs, Operas and Christmas Songs in different languages. Instruments are performed by their chaperones. A few of their numerous pieces are 'The Lord's Prayer, I Am A Happy Wanderer, How Great Thou Art, He's Got The Whole World In His Hands; Sara-Yoo Who, Spoonful of Sugar and from the opera, Morning Prayer from Cavaleri Rusticane.

An outstanding opportunity to train for a musical career is offered to an orphan of exceptional musical ability through the World Vision Korean Choir. Children are chosen from all the orphanages in every Korean city. The children who finally qualify are the children with the most talents as out of numerous groups of 8 only one is chosen.

The child who qualifies must be able to follow Mr. Paik when he plays a scale on the piano, be able to sing a hymn and folk-song. Vocal times, sense of rhythm, physical health, school records and disposition are carefully considered.

It is also impressed with the ministry as well as being a musical group. The children are all asked to memorize 240 verses from the Bible. When the first 70 verses have been perfectly memorized, the child is given a pencil for a gift. When the next 70 are learned the child receives a toothbrush and when the child has successfully repeated 240 lines, they receive a gold pin. As you see, the items appear very common and inexpensive here but they are very precious to the people of Korea.

The individual child, before going to World Vision, has experienced a very cruel life. One very such case is that of a small 8 year old boy Chang Woo Chul. His father was a drunkard. Often he used to spend his pay from previous days fishing on liquor, leaving his family starving and unclothed. One day his father came home drunk and started to beat the boy. Immediately his mother picked up a butcher's knife and struck him. This in itself would be a terrifying experience the boy would never forget. Then one day the boy's father hastened him on deck of his junk and took him to a strange port where he gave him some money and told him to buy some meat. The boy, happy that his family would once again be together, sauntered off to buy the meat. When he returned his father had gone.

He roamed the lonely streets until he caught pneumonia and was taken to World Vision. From then until today he has devoted his beautiful voice to the Orphanage Choir. Almost every member of the choir has witnessed such an experience.

While in the choir the children tend to forget their miseries and bring cheer and comfort to the children in the orphanage hospitals and institutions abroad.

It was a wonderful experience to see these children perform. Never have I heard such a terrific quality.

After watching these lonely children perform, it makes you realize how lucky you are to live in such a flourishing country as America.
