Wife Of Martyred Missionary To Speak At Markham Church

An unusual opportunity is afforded the people of this area to hear first hand what happened in the Congo in 1964 during the days of the Congolese Rebellion.

Mrs. Hector McMillan whose husband was one of twenty out of 68 Unvangelized Fields Mission missionaries (including children) that was killed during those days of martyrdom one year ago now, will be speaking in the Markham United Missionary Church in a missionary service which begins at 8 p.m. on Friday evening of this week, (November 12).

Mrs. McMillan writes regarding her husband's death. It was on Nov. 24. We had been under house arrest for 3 1/2 months living in the three buildings which comprised the headquarters of the Unvangelized Fields Mission. When the paratroop planes came overhead the soldiers across the road who were guarding us, became greatly excited. They lined us up in our backyard, separated the men from us, and told the rest to go back into the house. Nine women and fourteen children sat down in the living room of the mission headquarters. In a moment there was a man firing upon us and we all fell to the floor. When the shooting was over two of my sons were wounded and their father lay dead.

The McMillans have six sons. Mrs. McMillan hopes that by Sept. of 1966 she will be able to take five of her boys and return to continue her missionary service. The oldest son would remain in the United States to attend school.

Everyone is invited to hear Mrs. McMillan on Friday evening. Special music will be provided by a young ladies quintet from the Gormley United Missionary Church.

FOURTEEN POSTAGE STAMPS TO BE RELEASED IN 1966

Ottawa — The Honourable Rene Tremblay, Postmaster General, has announced that the stamp program for 1966 has been revised in order to allow for the addition of two new stamps to the philatelic schedule. The Commonwealth Parliamentary Association will be

honoured on a stamp to be released in early September, which will mark the opening of its 12th General Conference. The Commonwealth Parliamentary Association was founded in 1911 in order to bring about closer understanding and co-operation between those engaged in Parliamentary Government in the Commonwealth. Canada is to be the host country of this distinguished gathering. On June 30th, the floral emblem series will reach its culmination with the issue of a stamp featuring the Canadian coat of

arms, and a maple leaf. The date of issue was chosen to coincide as closely as possible with Dominion Day, July 1st. This stamp will be similar in size and format to the floral emblem and armorial bearing stamps of each of the ten provinces and the Northern Territories and will complete the series begun in 1964.

Mr. Tremblay listed the revised stamp schedule as follows: Space Research, following launching of the Alouette satellite; Alberta Floral, January 19; Saskatchewan Floral, January

19; Newfoundland Floral, February 23; Yukon Floral, March 23; Northwest Territories Floral, March 23; 300th Anniversary of La Salle's Arrival in Canada, April 13; Highway Safety, May 2; London Conference, May 26; Canada Coat of Arms (floral series), June 30; Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy July 27; Commonwealth Parliamentary Association Conference early September; Christmas 5c and 3c, October 12.

All stamps, except the 3c Christmas, will be of the 5c denomination.
