"Pour On" Method Treats Warble Flies In Beef Cattle

NEWMARKET — In the last two or three years, an entirely winter feeding period. Also, new approach has been taken the difficult job of spraying in on the control of warcle flies

for beef cattle. For a long time, the battle against warble flies has been fought with two rotenone sprays in the spring months. The principle was to kill the grubs as they emerged and in this way check the adult egg laying population.

It never worked very successfully because it required accurately timed spraying over all herds in the country. The spray programme coincided with cattle being turned out to pasture and this added up to frustration for both cattle owners and spray operators. Perhaps the weakest link of all was the fact that infested cattle lived through the whole winter with their problem. There is no doubt that warble grubs affect

New Method

The new method solves most of these problems. It uses a

systemic insecticide that sentative for York County, in the fall. The grubs are killed in the cattle soon after the material is put on, so that there is no loss of gain through the the spring is eliminated.

Application of the new material is easy and simple. It is poured on the backs of cattle with a small can or dipper. The amount used depends on the weight of the animal. With a cattle squeeze or a narrow crowding chute, a couple of men could do large numbers of cattle in an hour or two.

More Experience

The pour-on treatment is more expensive than spraying. "Pour on" works out to about 6 cents per hundred pounds live weight, or 36 cents for a 600 lbs. animal. However, the extra gain and the easier method of application should easily offset the extra cost. If cattle are badly infested, profit from the new method is well worthwhile.
