TWO NEW POSTAGE STAMPS

The Honourable Rene Tremblay, Postmaster General, designated January 19, 1966 as being the release date for two new stamps featuring the floral emblems and armorial bearings of the Provinces of Saskatchewan and Alberta.

These large size 5c stamps will be the ninth and tenth in the floral emblem series which began in May, 1964.

The prairie lily was chosen as Saskatchewan's floral emblem in 1941. This stamp is printed in brown, green and orange. Alberta adopted the wild rose as its official emblem in 1930. Tones of red and green were used to

print this stamp. The stamps were designed and printed by the Canadian Bank Note Company of Ottawa from data provided by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. The offset method was used to print the floral emblems. The provincial coat of arms and the backgrounds were printed by the intaglio process.

There will be 15 million Alberta stamps issued and 14½ million Saskatchewan stamps issued.

Ernest Hunt was Thresher for Over Twenty Years

BETHESDA — This community was saddened on Sunday morning when news was received of the passing of Ernest Hunt who had entered the York County Hospital in Newmarket only on Wednesday of last week. He was stricken with a heart attack.

Born at Gormley the late Mr. Hunt had lived all his life in the area with the exception of about four years spent in the West. He became well-known in both the Townships of Markham and Whitchurch when he operated a threshing unit from farm to farm. This kind of work covered a period of more than 30 years. He used steam power for a time and later operated a Rumley Oil-Pull. In recent years, he worked out of his own machine shop and was an expert on mower sharpening and repairs. He was 76.

Mr. Hunt was a member of the Gormley United Missionary Church where he held the office of Treasurer at one time and also taught a class in the Sunday School. His first wife, the former Edith Hoover passed away in 1953. He later married Ethel Empringham in 1959 who survives along with two daughters, Marion (Mrs. Willis Hunking) of Nigeria; Ruth (Mrs. Ron Elliott) of Gormley; two brothers Thomas and Joe and two sisters, Mrs. Anna Randall and Mrs. Mable Olsen, all of Tisdale, Saskatchewan.

Rev. L. K. Sider conducted the funeral service from the Gormley United Missionary Church on Tuesday afternoon at 2 p.m., assisted by Rev. C. Hunking with interment in Heise Hill Cemetery. 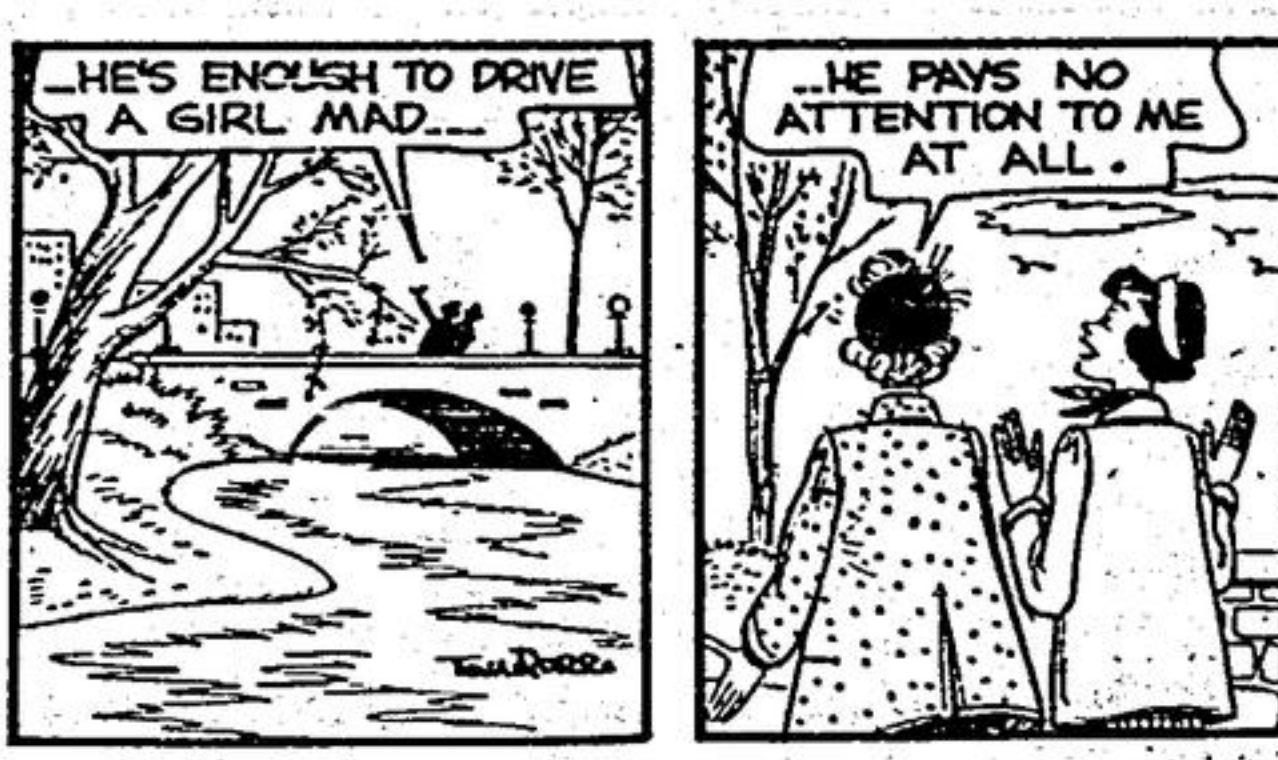

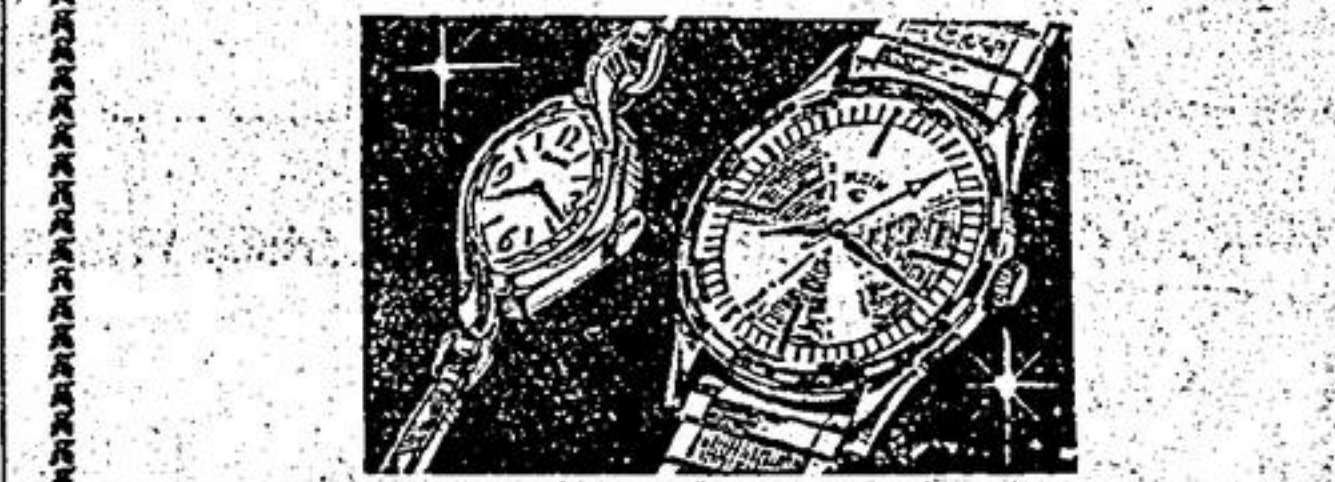

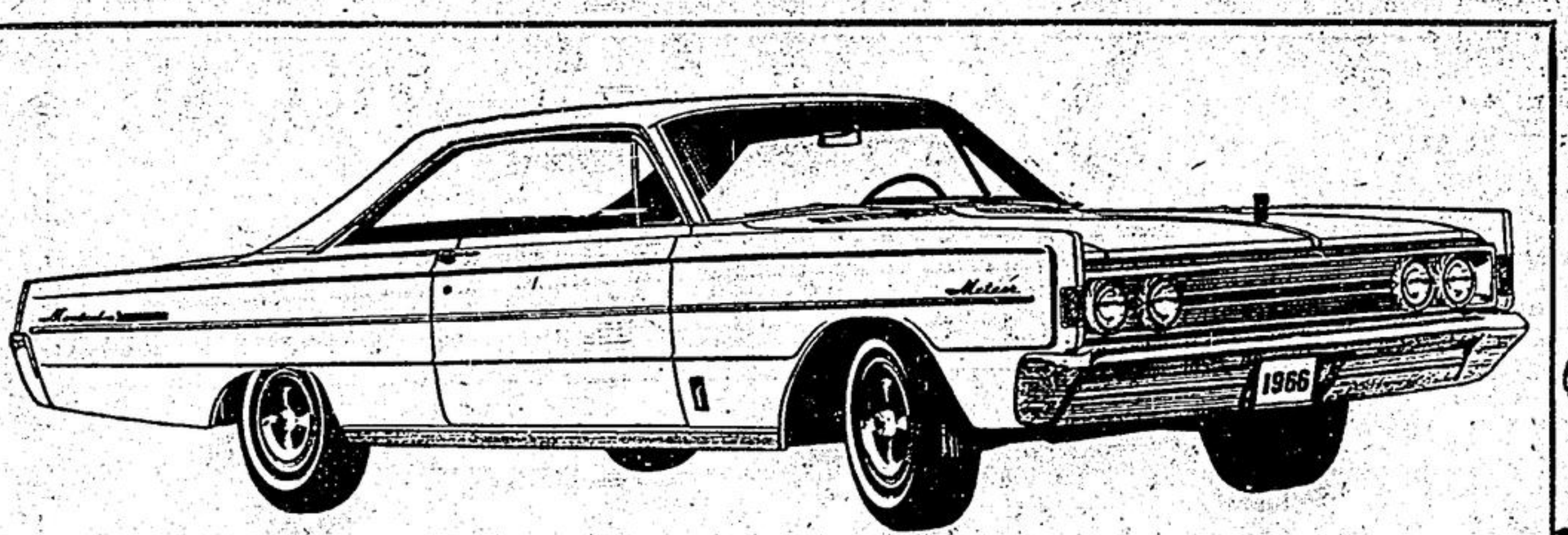
