Santa Claus And Suicides

Psychologists say that Christmas is the most disturbing season of the year for those who lack family or close friends. Lonely men and women — even those of usually cheerful temperament — become deeply depressed and, in extreme cases, suicidal during the holiday season.

One organization which has traditionally recognized the importance of preventing this dangerous depression — the Christmas syndrome in psychological jargon — is The Salvation Army. Since its beginning, one hundred years ago, the Army has made it an important part of its ministry to bring some of the joy of this holy season to those who are out of the mainstream of life.

To the elderly pensioner living in a small furnished room, the prisoner behind bars, the sick and frightened, the forsaken child and the abandoned residents of skid row, Salvationists bring the cheer of music, conversation, personal concern and a bit of the general festivity that is such a great part of the Christmas observance. And because these kindnesses are dispensed in the name of the Christ Child, a deeper sense of the true meaning of Christmas is often renewed in these lonely persons, their bitterness and feelings of neglect softened through the interest shown in them by The Salvation Army.

During the holiday season, Salvation Army musical groups, Officers and Workers visit Correctional Service institutions to conduct services and individual counseling sessions. Prisoners often ask Salvationists to send Christmas gifts to their children, "from Daddy." During counselling sessions, prisoners affected by the spirit of Christ-




