Santa Claus And Suicides

Psychologists say that Christmas is the most disturbing season of the year for those who lack family or close friends. Lonely men and women — even those of usually cheerful temperament — become deeply depressed and, in extreme cases, suicidal during the holiday season.

One organization which has traditionally recognized the importance of preventing this dangerous depression — the Christmas syndrome — is The Salvation Army. Since its beginning, one hundred years ago, the Army has made it an important part of its ministry to bring some of the joy of this holy season to those who are out of the mainstream of life. To the elderly pensioner living in a small furnished room, the prisoner behind bars, the sick and frightened, the forsaken child and the abandoned residents of skid row, Salvationists bring the cheer of music, conversation, personal concern and a bit of the general festivity that is such a great part of the Christmas observance. And because these kindnesses are dispensed in the name of the Christ Child, a deeper sense of the true meaning of Christmas is often renewed in these lonely persons, their bitterness and feelings of neglect softened through the interest shown in them by The Salvation Army.

During the holiday season, Salvation Army musical groups, Officers and Workers visit Correctional Service institutions to conduct services and individual counseling sessions. Prisoners often ask Salvationists to send Christmas gifts to their children, "from Daddy." During counselling sessions, prisoners, affected by the spirit of Christ-

mas, often express a wish to contact abandoned or alienated family members. Salvation Army officers become prompt emissaries in establishing renewed bonds between husbands and wives and parents and children. The miracle of Christmas is the sense of diffused love and kindness that the spirit of the season engenders in even the most unlikely individuals. And The Salvation Army officer — while most citizens are shopping and party going — is seeking out the wretched and lonely to try to help them experience this miracle of Christmas.

During the weeks before the big day, Salvation Army music makers visit scores of hospitals to play and sing the beautiful old carols. The Army's League of Mercy volunteer workers bring gaily wrapped gifts to each patient, and the merry spirit of the season touches lonely and discouraged invalids. In cities and towns, pale and pathetic derelicts and drifters find a homelike welcome at Salvation Army centres.

On Christmas day itself, many Salvationists take time off from their own family celebrations to see to it that traditional holiday dinners are served to many who are alone and in need. Salvation Army Harbour Light and Rehabilitation Centres across Canada open their doors to accommodate those in need, without discrimination. Gala decorations, gift of fruit for all comers, and a full course turkey dinner are included in the annual Yuletide Program.

All of the lonely men and women who share in Christmas joy through the good offices of The Salvation Army are aware that the organization's interest in their problems continues year

round. In-prison counselling, rehabilitation of alcoholics, visits to hospitals and to the homes of elderly shut-ins are important ongoing programs of the Army. But during the celebration of the birthday of Christ, their brotherly love and concern for others is especially significant and comforting to their fellow Canadians who would not want any man or woman to be friend-

less and neglected during this happy season of the year.

This is the one-hundredth Christmas of The Salvation Army. Its officers and members look forward to the opportunity of dispensing love and compassion in the name of Christ to many more thousands of the needy and lonely during the Army's next great century of service to God and man.
