### Lot Fees Of \$34,000 To Pickering School Boards

BROUGHAM - Four school boards in the Township of Pickering will receive the benefit of lot fee collections, according to a decision of the Committee of Adjustment.

The total figure, up to the end of December, 1965, is \$31,000. It will be divided as follows: Public School Area. No. 1 - \$9,500; Public \*School Area No. 2 - \$23, 000; Public School 4W. -\$1,000 and Separate School No. 6 - \$500.

The sum of \$500 has been collected for each new residential lot created in Pickering Township to be used to offset capital school expenses that are not under the Provincial grant struc-

It was agreed, by motion, that it was unreasonable to continue the collection of such fees without direct benefit to the municipality and its residents in accordance with the prearranged

Through the approval of council, the fees will be transferred to the four school boards on the agreement that the same policy will be followed. The transfer of funds will then be continued on an annual

The motion, made by Jean McPherson and seconded by Melvin Johnson, was unanimously supported by all members.

### .Norman Smith Heads Farm Safety Council

UXBRIDGE - The annual meeting of the Ontario County Farm Safety Council was held here last week. The projects, carried out

in 1965, were reviewed. They included a Farm and Home Safety Poster Compewith rural school pupils. In this competition 714 posters were received. and prize money of \$216.00 was paid out. 'A farm safety exhibit was set up at Beaverton Fair. Slow moving' vehicle signs and fire extinguishers were sold to farmers through safety projects sponsored by the Brooklin and Beaverton Ralph Veitch, Uxbridge R.R. Junior Farmers. Five hundred safety calendars were given out and five thousand farm safety servicites are being distributed to farm organizations in Ontario County.


Sales opened on Dec. 1 and there are still more than a million and a half vehicles operating with the old numbers.
