'No Picnic', Adjacent Land Owners Protest

GOODWOOD — An infor agreement has been made with the owners of a 15 acre field concerning its use as a site for picnics.

The owners have agreed to notify the surrounding landowners and the clerk of Uxbridge township whenever the land is to be used for picnics of more than 50 persons.

Uxbridge Township Council received several complaints from the landowners following a picnic attended by about 25,000 members of a Macedonian organization. The complaints include trespassing, littering, abusive language, indecent exposure and improperly tended fires.

Council is awaiting a report from John Robeson of the Ontario County Health Unit, on overcrowding and sanitary facilities on the property. The report will outline the number of people allowed on the property for a picnic and the sanitary facilities required.

AIR COMPLAINTS
Each of the parties involved told their stories to Council. G. N. Luker, Dennis Ward, George Smith, Gordon Clark and T. W. Trentos appeared in person. Mr. Trentos spoke for the three owners of the land.

Mr. Luker told of cleaning garbage and burying refuse after the July 31 picnic. He also told how several hundred had trespassed on his property.

He said, "I've been there for 20 odd years and I'm determined they're not going to drive me out, or burn me out either."

TOO MUCH NOISE
Dennis Ward, who operates a milk farm to the north-east of the park, expressed concern for the effect the noise of the loud-speaker system on his animals in the spring.

Mr. Luker, Mr. Ward, Gordon Clark and Deputy-Reeve Robert Nesbitt complained about the noise of the loud-speaker system. Deputy-Reeve Nesbitt lives a half-mile from the park.
