Markham Twp. School Library Program Is Unique In Province

UNIONVILLE — One of the prime aims of Jack Nemchin, library consultant to the elementary school systems of Markham Township, is to instill in young children the love of books.

This is why the primary sections of school libraries in Markham Township will be larger than those found in many public libraries.

Mr. Nemchin plans the school libraries and selects the books. He chooses both fiction and non-fiction on a wide range of subjects.

A feeder library installed at Hagerman school in September will be used to train student librarians for the elementary system. A seven-week Library In-service Course for students in grades 7 to 10 for the York Central District High School Board began there November 2.

There are about 4,500 titles in the library at Hagerman and school libraries will be duplicates of the program. Mr. Nemchin is constantly reading new books to keep the selection up to date.

Because he is better able to keep in touch with changes in the public school courses and the books available, Mr. Nemchin supervises text-book purchasing for Markham Township Areas 1 and 2.

Markham Township schools are the first to have a library consultant and Ontario Educational Television filmed a program on the commendable work Mr. Nemchin is doing.

Impaired; Fined \$100

BUTTONVILLE — An 18 year old Lake Wilcox youth was given until January 6 to pay a \$100 fine when he was convicted of impaired driving in Richmond Hill Court Tuesday.

He had pleaded not guilty to the charge.

P.C. John Morrison, Markham Township Police, testified he had followed a car driven by George Alfred Robinson, 18, south on Don Mills road from Gormley at speeds approaching 80 m.p.h.

Const. Morrison testified that Robinson had used abusive language while in the cruiser and later in the police station at Buttonville.

Robinson told the court he treated police officers the same way they treated him. He said he and two other youths in the car had each drank four bottles of beer during the evening before.

Constable Daniel Denby assisted in the case.

Addresses Federation Of University Women

Dr. Mary Quayle Innis addressed the York County Club of the Canadian Federation of University Women at King City Nov. 28. She spoke on "The Clear Spirit," a biographical account of 20 Canadian women edited by Dr. Innis.

The women chosen for the book represent different periods in the development of Canadian society and each gained recognition on account of their own efforts and skills.

Accounts about English-speaking women are written in English while those about French-Canadian women are in French. The cost of publishing both English and French editions prompted the decision.

Dr. Maude Abbott, a

medical pioneer at the turn of the century, was a cardiologist from Montreal whose book was the official text for 25 years.

Dr. Innis noted that histories and biographies are more popular reading now perhaps because people are looking to the past for reassurance in a time of uncertainty and crisis. She said that biographies of prominent Canadians such as Laurier and Macdonald were widely read. She felt that "The Clear Spirit" would help fill the gaps in Canada's history between these important people.
