Require Hospital Additions

NEWMARKET — York County Council of 1967 will be asked to consider a recommendation by the Finance Committee to approve additions to both the York County Hospital at Newmarket and the York Central Hospital at Richmond Hill. The total cost to the County over a 20 year period, including interest, has been estimated at eight million dollars.

Reeve Donald Plaxton of Richmond Hill argued that his municipality could not be expected to cover the cost of an enlarged sewer disposal unit that might be required to serve the enlarged hospital quarters. Reeve E. J. Norris of Georgina felt that further consideration should be given to the building of smaller units, possibly in the north or in the Markham-Stouffville area. The committee's report was received but adoption was reserved.
