PICKERING — Ward Three was the centre of objections to new ward boundaries for Pickering Township heard at an Ontario Municipal Board hearing in the Council Chambers, Dec. 19.

Many of the witnesses felt the ward is a growth area! The eastern portion of the ward is rural but it is being built-up in the west. There are many subdivisions in the ward but none have services. An application is before the O.M.B. for water and sewage.

The population of the new ward three would be 6,227 while the old ward three has a population of 10,179. In both cases Ward Three is the largest of the five wards.

Former Councillor of Ward 4, John Campbell described the land to be annexed to Wards One and Two as having possibilities of rapid development and contended it should not be included in the rural area.

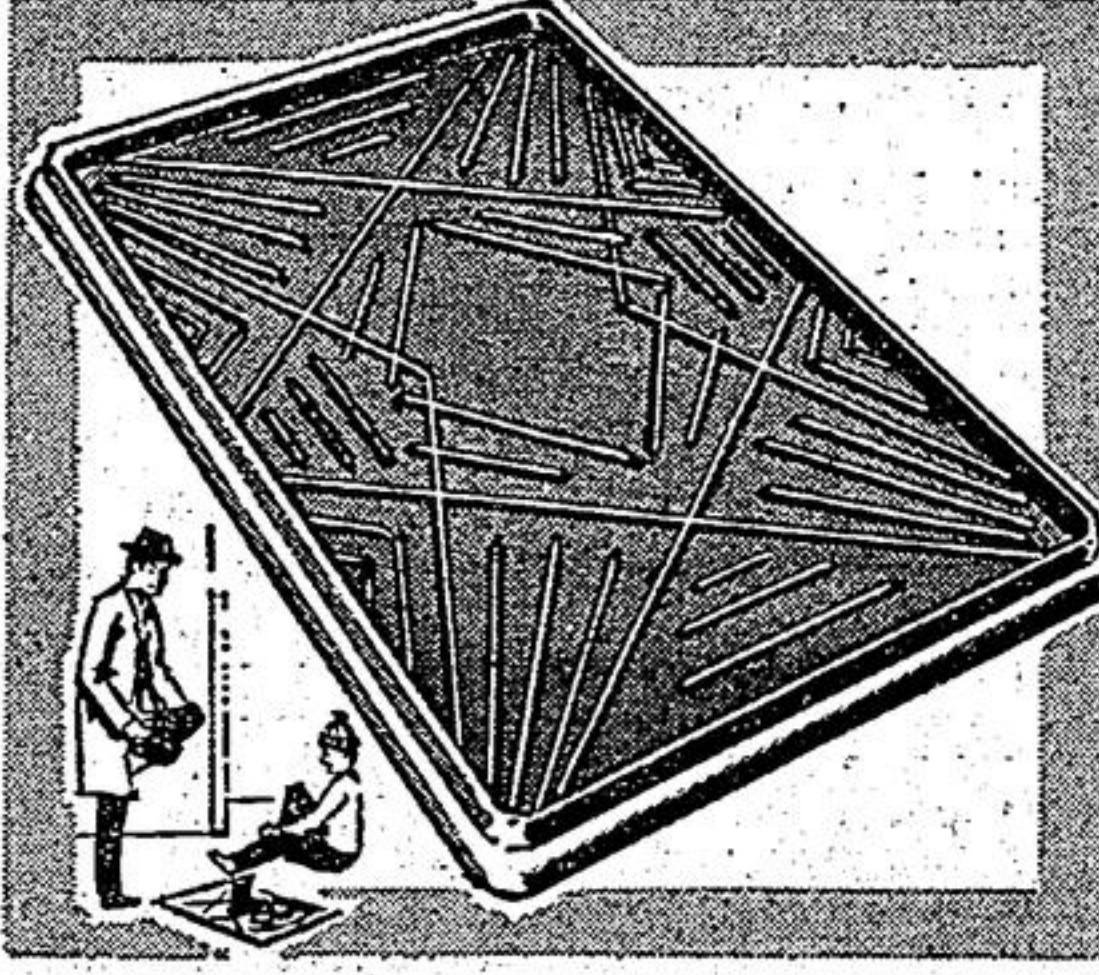

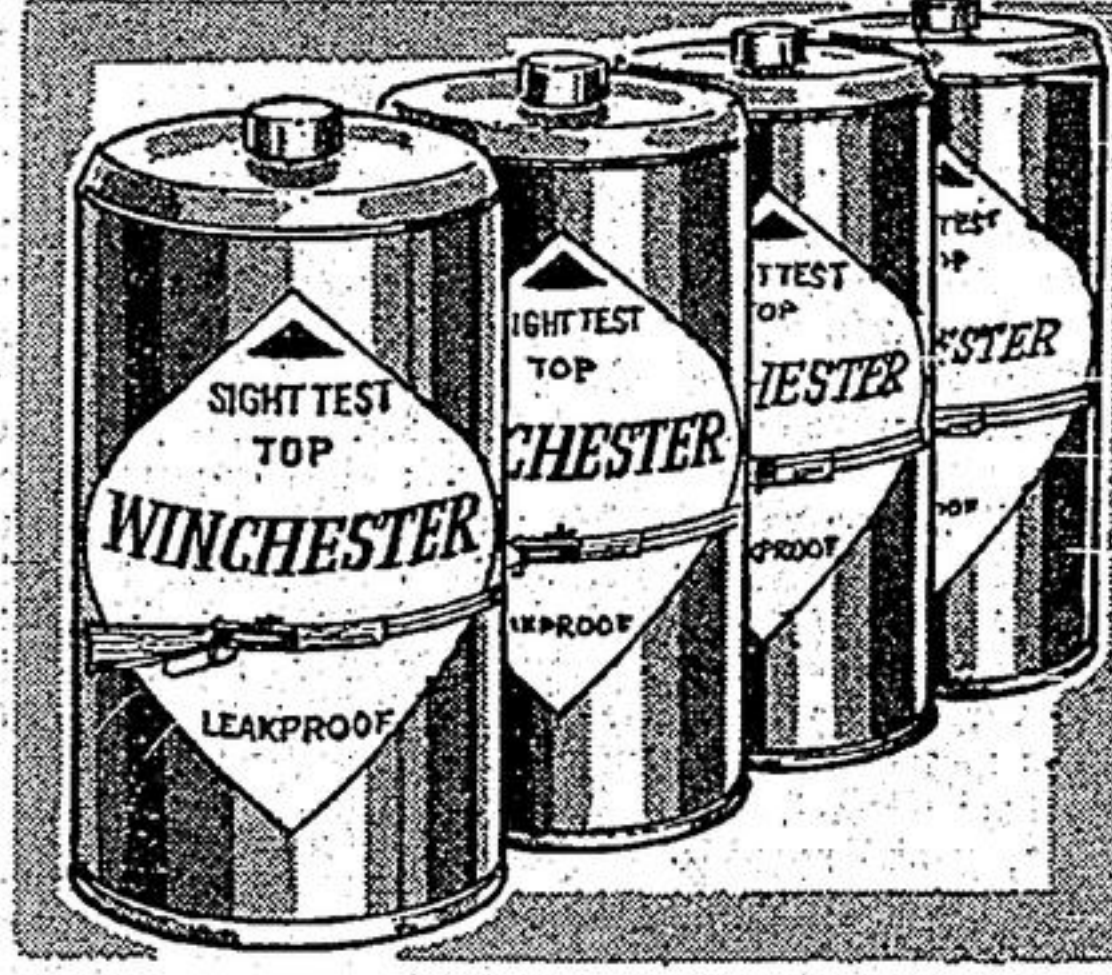

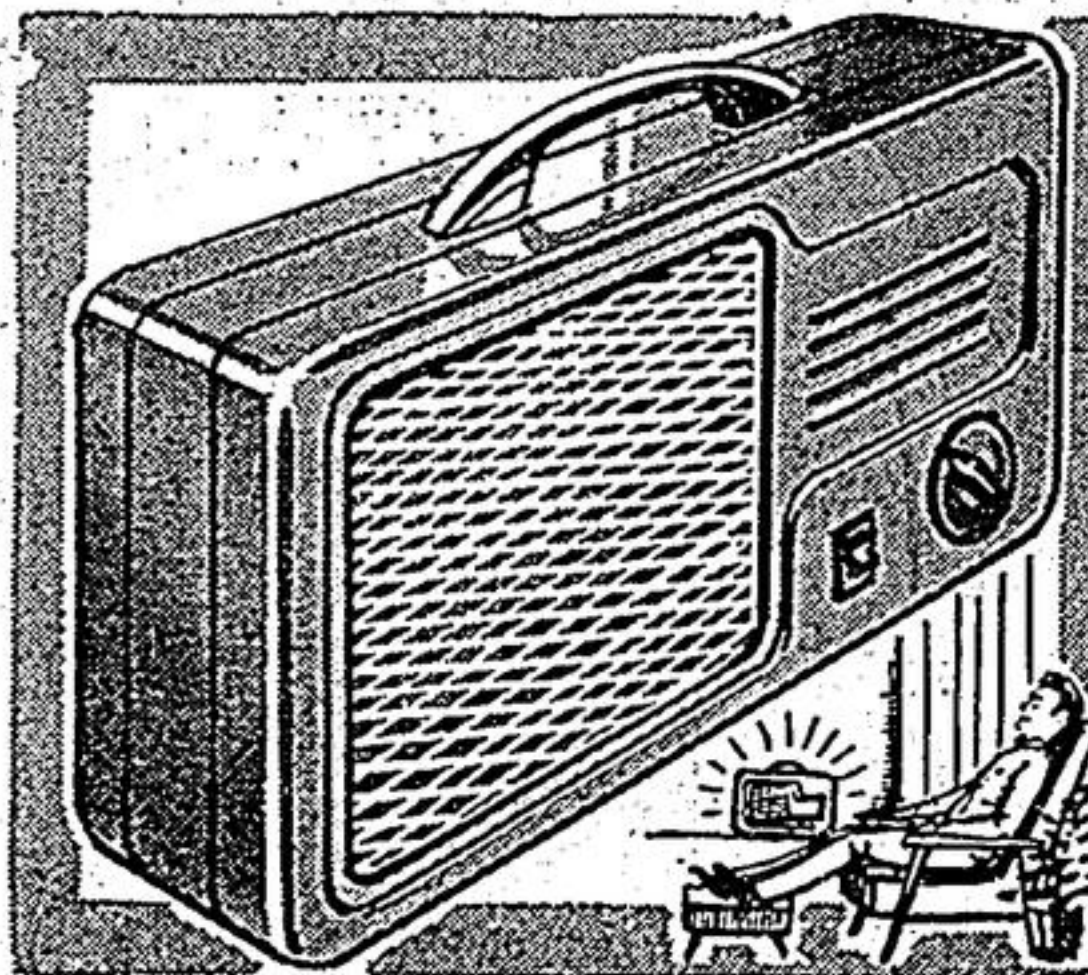
