Teen Hair Styles

THE CLASSIC PONY TAIL LOOKS SUPER IN '67

CUT: Shoulder length with a blunt edge cut. Hair must be very shiny, in excellent condition for this style.

TO SET: No setting is really necessary for thick freshly washed hair with good body. For thin hair that needs some body set as in diagram using 1" rollers.

TO COMB: Brush vigorously over all then begin brushing all hair upward sharply for a very pulled-up look. Secure at top of crown with a wide ribbon tied in a flip-py bow.
