

# Stouffville Midgets Defeat Markham To Win Group Title

## Other Teams All Out

STOUFFVILLE — The early rounds of group playoff action are now over and Stouffville teams have suffered heavily, both in O.H.A. and O.M.H.A. competition.

The only home club left in the running are the Midgets. They defeated Markham 3-0 and 5-2 to sweep the Group Championship in two straight. Their coach is Alex Wilkins. The manager is Earl Crowder.

The team will now await a winner from one of the other leagues, possibly North York.
