

Rev. C. N. Good Minister 50 Years

Rev. C. N. Good, a United Missionary Church minister for 50 years, died on Friday at South Waterloo Memorial Hospital, Galt, following a brief illness. He was 97.

Mr. Good was well-known in Stouffville and had attended church conventions here on several occasions.

Mr. Good was the oldest minister in the United Missionary Church. Born Nov. 19, 1869, in Clarinda, Indiana, he was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Good.

Six months after his birth his parents moved to Canada and in 1879 they moved to Kitchener.

Mr. Good was appointed assistant pastor of Bethany

United Missionary Church in Kitchener at the 1894 annual conference. In 1895 he received his first charge in Port Elgin and subsequently served in Elmwood, Breslau, Aylmer, Toronto, Markham and Kitchener. He served at Bethany Church in Kitchener from 1911 to 1913 and from 1937 to 1942.

In addition to his pastoral work he was district superintendent for seven years, president of the City Mission Workers Society for 20 years and treasurer of the Women's Missionary Society for 40 years. He also spent four years in evangelistic work.

Mr. Good retired from active service in 1942, but he continued assisting mis-

sonaries and ministers in his later years. Eleven years ago he moved to Fairview Mennonite Home in Preston where he lived until his death. He was predeceased by three wives, the former Lavina Snyder, Lily C. Hallman and Linal Brothers.

Surviving are two sons, Ira M. Blair and Gordon R. (Grace) Cressman of Kitchener and Mrs. Paul (Myrtle) Steiner of Elkhart, Ind., two step-daughters, Mrs. Leigh (Adele) Wilcox and Mrs. George (Muriel) Ebert, both of Norwich; one sister, Mrs. Ida Holman of Guelph; 16 grandchildren and 22 great-grandchildren.

Funeral service was conducted Monday by Rev. Ward M. Shantz, Ontario district superintendent and Rev. C. E. Hunking, pastor of Bethany United Missionary Church. Interment was Woodland Cemetery.

In The Editor's Mail

Dear Mr. Editor,

This has been prompted by the front page account of the division among local churches over the Women's Day of Prayer. The representatives of the ladies' groups of the evangelical churches who were interviewed seemed reluctant or unprepared to explain the reason for this separation. One would hesitate to do this with his or her name attached because the real reason would appear to condemn individuals who are personal friends. However, to remain silent invites the charge of a "holier-than-thou" attitude. What is more important, it would be neglecting an opportunity to explain the Gospel.

Of the three local Protestant groups from which the evangelicals have withdrawn at this time, the largest has more or less officially claimed the right to delete from the Bible that with which it does not agree. It is held up to question, and some of its leading spokesmen to ridicule, the claims of Christ to be the only begotten Son of God. It has denied His claim to be the only way to God and heaven. "No man cometh unto the Father but by Me." The other two groups are seeking affiliation with the first, and more and more of their ordained ministers are taking the same position. While most evangelicals recognize that probably there are many true believers among these groups, we find it difficult to dissociate them from the official position of their churches and the teaching of their spokesmen. The Scripture teaches about those in the "days who have a form of godliness but deny the power thereof: from such turn away, for they are become leavened with the lump."

A prayer fellowship can be a deep spiritual experience. Those who reject Christ's personal claims regarding Himself, as mentioned previously, we cannot consider brothers or sisters in the Lord. To really understand the evangelical position, you must understand what we mean by the term "Christian believer." It may mean something else to others. A Christian to us is one, who, through conviction by the Holy Spirit, has been made conscious of his natural sinful condition and his separation from fellowship with God, has confessed this and in faith claimed the promise of forgiveness of God through the substitutionary and atoning death of His Son, Jesus Christ. He is then "born of the Spirit," becomes a "new creature" in Christ, a love servant of the One who died for him. This goes much deeper than a mental assent to the truth of the Gospel. It involves a personal, experimental claim on the promises of God. Those who have experienced this transformation have a fellowship with others of like faith which does not recognize denominational boundaries. This is the only ecumenicity that evangelicals understand.
