

# Claremont Quits Uxbridge Lg. Following Player Protest

## Feeling Runs High

UXBRIDGE — Team protests, frayed tempers, charges and counter charges have pushed the continuance of the Uxbridge Community Hockey League to the point of no return.

Claremont, with the group title within their grasp, has pulled out of further playoff competition, although they lead the final series with Ballantrae 2 games to 0 with one game tied.

Claremont Coach, Jack Jensen claims that Ballantrae is using an illegal player and every contest in the finals has been played under protest. He charges that the League President has refused to call a meeting over the issue. The man in question is Gary Jackson who, according to Mr. Jensen performed with the Uxbridge 'Black Hawks' in at least one Intermediate game against Trenton.

### AUTOMATIC CHAMPIONS

Coach Jensen argues that if the league had ruled in favor of the Claremont protest, the tie game with Ballantrae would become a win and Claremont would be the automatic champions.

"I personally would like to give them another game because I know we have a good club and could beat them but feeling is running high and someone might get injured," he said. He noted that one Claremont player had already been thrown out for the remainder of the season. He said that following a team vote, Sunday, the club decided to withdraw, trophy or no trophy.

Resentment on the Ballantrae side is, according to reports, equally hostile. Team Coach, Jack Palmer was not available for comment.

Should Claremont decide to return to the fray, the fourth game of the finals would likely be played Sunday night. Chances of this are highly unlikely, however, Coach Jensen told The Tribune.
