BUTTONVILLE — A freak accident on the Don Mills Road south of Highway No. 7, March 30, sent two persons to York Central Hospital. Most seriously hurt was Mrs. Roland Gough of R.R. 1, Sharon. She was a passenger in a southbound Volkswagen and suffered a fractured skull, fractured pelvis and internal injuries. Mr. Gough suffered head injuries and a fractured pelvis. Markham Township police said that the steering column on a northbound truck broke, causing the vehicle to veer into the southbound lane. The Gough car rammed into the side of it.
