

# Newmarket Wins Centennial Bantam Tournament

## Thump Markham 12-4

STOUFFVILLE — Newmarket Bantams captured the centennial hockey tournament title in Stouffville Saturday with a sweep of three games. They blanked Ajax 6-0; downed Uxbridge 6-2 and thumped Markham in the finals, 12-4.

The consolation trophy went to Thornhill who defeated Port Perry 6-1.

In other contests, Stouffville edged Thornhill, 3-2; Markham whipped Woodbridge 10-3; Uxbridge downed Port Perry 2-1; Thornhill whaloped Woodbridge 11-1; Markham trimmed Stouffville 3-1 and Port Perry beat Ajax 6-3.

In the Markham-Newmarket final it was Jim Cowell, John Rousom, Barry Foster and Frode Neilson who led the way for the winners. Paul Raymer, a standout for Markham throughout the tourney, scored one with other single tallies going to Bob Bidan, Ken Young and Jim Tettmar.

The contest was rough and rugged at times with fifteen penalties called.
