Protest To Premier

PICKERING — The aftermath of the crowd that descended on Pickering Township council to protest their staggering tax rate, will be a brief sent to Premier John Roberts.

Ratepayers' meetings are being held in nearly all tax areas of the township to cry against the biggest jump in property taxes in Pickering's history.

A resolution was unanimously passed at a council meeting that a brief be prepared in conjunction with council and the school board, and forwarded to the Prime Minister.

Township auditors are compiling figures to be included in the brief.

PICKERING — A Pickering Township fire truck has been sold for \$25.75.

Surplus To Help Reduce Tax Levy

BUTTONVILLE — Markham Township Council completed last year's business with a surplus of \$135,037. The amount of taxes collected in 1966 was \$3,001,496 as against \$2,322,343 the year before.

Reeve Stewart Rumble said this week that the surplus would be used to reduce the tax demand for this year. The collections of taxes was gratifying to council, 94.8% being collected. Council in reviewing the annual Auditor's report also noted that the total amount of money collected and in the account had risen to \$404,397.

The long-term debt of the municipality presently stands at \$6,055,241.
