

Pressure Groups Hurting Pickering

PICKERING — Township Reeve Clifford Laycox said the municipality is losing industry because of the adverse publicity it was receiving through a Ray Ridges' pressure group.

Speaking in reply to resolutions and allegations from a meeting of the Bay Ridges Ratepayers' Association, the reeve said: "The costs are there, they have to be met."

The ratepayers also suggested that no more houses be built in the township until industry is established.

"We will not get an industrial park of any kind in this township unless we agree to a 40-60 industrial-residential ratio to a developer," replied the reeve.

"At the present time we cannot even talk to a large water using industry because our facilities are inadequate. The only way the township can get industry is by having a developer contribute \$1,500,000 to the expansion of our sewage facilities, \$1,000,000 to an increase in the water treatment plant and he must further be responsible for all the trunk

main to the development. "If the development was large enough we might even insist that they build schools and a new fire and police station as well as providing sufficient assessment to service the development commercially," added Reeve Laycox.

"These people (ratepayers) know only one side of the story. They cannot get services without paying for them."

Reeve Laycox said he would like to see school boards in the township collect their own taxes. He said school boards should not even be considering building luxury schools like the new experimental William Davis public school.

Mr. Laycox said that since 1964 the mill rate for schools, county and police had risen from 69.7 to 93.6 while the township rate had gone from 12.9 to 22.7 in the same period.

Reeve Laycox said there was a way to lower taxes in the township, by cutting out some of the services.

"If we kick out the libraries, the recreation and parks along with the garbage collection, the rate will drop two mills. If we drop the working

capital fund and the servicing and purchasing of industrial land program the rate will drop another 2.2 mills. Stopping all work

on roads would lower the tax bill by another 7.5 mills.

"We are the laughing stock of the province because of the adverse publicity we have received from these pressure groups," said the reeve. "These ratepayer groups are controlled by politicians and there will never be a place for party politics in municipal governments."
