Conservation Parks Open April 29

MTRCA officials say there's excellent fishing opportunities in most of the streams that flow through the conservation areas including: Glen Haffy, Lower Rouge, Palgrave, Albion Hills, Heart Lake, Claremont and Greenwood. All of the area streams are stocked with speckled trout except Heart Lake which has rain (Kamloops) trout. Boats are available to the public at Heart Lake.
