

Mrs. Austin Reesor Respected Teacher

CEDAR GROVE — Although Olive Reesor was brought up in Cedar Grove and lived all her married life here, she did not belong solely to Cedar Grove. This was clearly evidenced when, over the weekend more than six hundred and fifty paid their last tribute to this most remarkable woman. Olive was a dedicated teacher much appreciated by pupils she had taught in Hillside and Oak Ridges before she was married and by pupils of the last few years nearer home. It was her policy whenever the children became listless to pep up the schoolroom with music and the songs were always lively. They loved her for it and for her clear, straightforward teaching. Many memories of this aspect of her life were exchanged at her funeral, one of the largest Markham has ever seen.


