Three Whiffs, Then Wham!

STOUFFVILLE — For three trips to the plate, Wednesday night, Stouffville's Roger Todd had little luck. In fact, he was a strikeout victim in each appearance and batting in a key third slot position. Then it happened. With one mate aboard and two out, he teed off on an inside pitch and drove it well over the outfield fence. The drive cleared the sacks and gave the I.G.A. an 8-0 lead over Sonya, the visitors. The homesters added a pair to win handily, 10-1. As in most previous contests, Stouffville had their big guns going in the very first inning and after two, were out front 6-0. A combination of errors and wildness hurt Sonya's chances. In four innings, they bobbled the ball seven times. Their pitcher, Tom Finley gave up six walks and hit two men.

Glenn Jackson was never in trouble on the Stouffville mound although lapped for a double and a single in the 4th. He struck out 8 of the 18 men he faced. In addition to Roger Todd's four-bagger, Larry Spang, Bill Lehman and Jackson poked out singles. Leftfielder, Jerry Lewis had an interesting night at the plate. He appeared at bat four times, was safe on two errors, drew a walk and was hit by the pitcher. He counted three of his team's ten runs.

Jackson Halts Manilla Rally

STOUFFVILLE — South-paw hurler, Glenn Jackson put a stopper on a determined rally by Manilla, Sunday, that threatened to wipe out an early-inning lead and break the Stouffville string of four straight wins. The lefthander performed the feat in fine style, preserving a 4-3 victory and running the winning streak to five.

Mike Cadieux was the Stouffville starter. Murray Holden took over in the 6th with Jackson coming on in the 7th. Larry Spang with two runs, Roger Todd and George McKay chalked up the Stouffville scores. Both Todd and McKay rapped out doubles and completed the circuit. Spang walked both times. Cadieux also drilled out a two-bagger but was left stranded.

Plan For Annual Event

STOUFFVILLE — A centennial Track and Field Meet, to include athletes from thirteen public and separate schools in the area, will be held on the grounds of St. Mark's, Stouffville this Saturday, June 17. The event, the first of its kind ever organized, will begin at 9 a.m. and conclude at 4 p.m. with the presentation of awards. Student entries from Gades 4 to 8 will come from the following schools: Pine Orchard, Armitage, Hillcrest, Lloyd, Bloomington, Lemonville, Ballantrac, Lake Wilcox, Glasgow, Claremont, Orchard Park, Summit View and St. Mark's.

Chief organizers of the Meet include: Mrs. Betty Sanders, Lemonville; Gary Harrison, Claremont; Gary Grundy, Orchard Park; Bob Stover, Summitview; Jack Shepe, Lake Wilcox and Gino Ferri, St. Mark's. They hope to make it an annual competition. The public is invited.

A six-lane 220 yard track has been marked out in addition to two high jump pits.

Grouping of entries is according to ages as of June 1. There are four classes, Junior, 9 to 10 years; Intermediate, 11 to 12 years; Senior 'A', 13 to 14 years and Senior 'B', 15 to 16 years. Added new events include a Senior Mile Relay for boys and girls in Senior 'A' and 'B'; an Open Mile for boys (all ages); a senior girl's 440; a senior girl's shot put (8 lb.) and an Open Half Mile for girls.

Eight trophies will be presented to the champions of boys and girls in four classes. These will be suitably engraved and retained in the school where that student is now attending. Awards have been donated by: Mr. W. D. Atkinson; MacLean's Furniture; Sanders B-A; Stouffville Bakery; Stouffville Centennial Committee; Stouffville School Board; Whitchurch Area School Board and The Stouffville Tribune. In addition, each champion will receive a smaller trophy which he may keep.

As a benefit to both the attending public and competing athletes, a catering service will be available on the grounds during the noon hour.

Wins In First Inning

Beats Own Record

STOUFFVILLE — Stouffville I.G.A. won another baseball game in the first inning, Friday. They scored 9 runs in their first time at bat and beat Valentinia 9-3.

Thirteen Stouffville players paraded to the plate in the 1st, belting out 7 hits. From then on, it was a matter of holding their rivals in check. Mike Cadieux performed that chore, scattering eight hits. Mike Cadieux and Ted Suzuki connected for the only extra-base blows for Stouffville, both doubles. Roger Todd, Dave Slack and George McKay each collected two singles. Cadieux also had a single in the first.

MARKHAM — Susan Nigh, conc. 7. Markham, soared to her best outdoor high jump ever on Saturday when she cleared the pole at 5 feet 7 3/4 inches. She was an entry in the Eastern Canadian track and field championships held at Waterloo on the weekend. Susan made a determined bid for the Canadian open record of 5 feet 9 inches and could still equal or top this mark before the end of the season.

In the long jump competition, she placed 4th. Her best distance was 18 feet 3/4 inch.

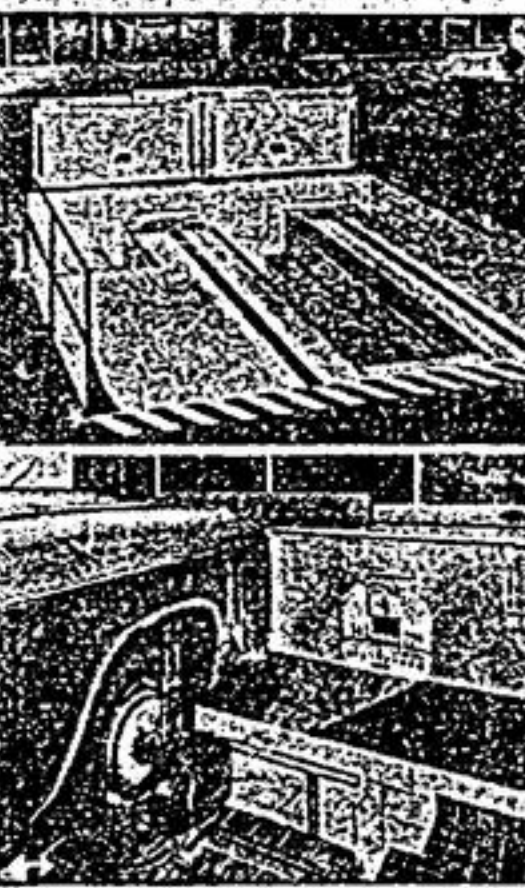

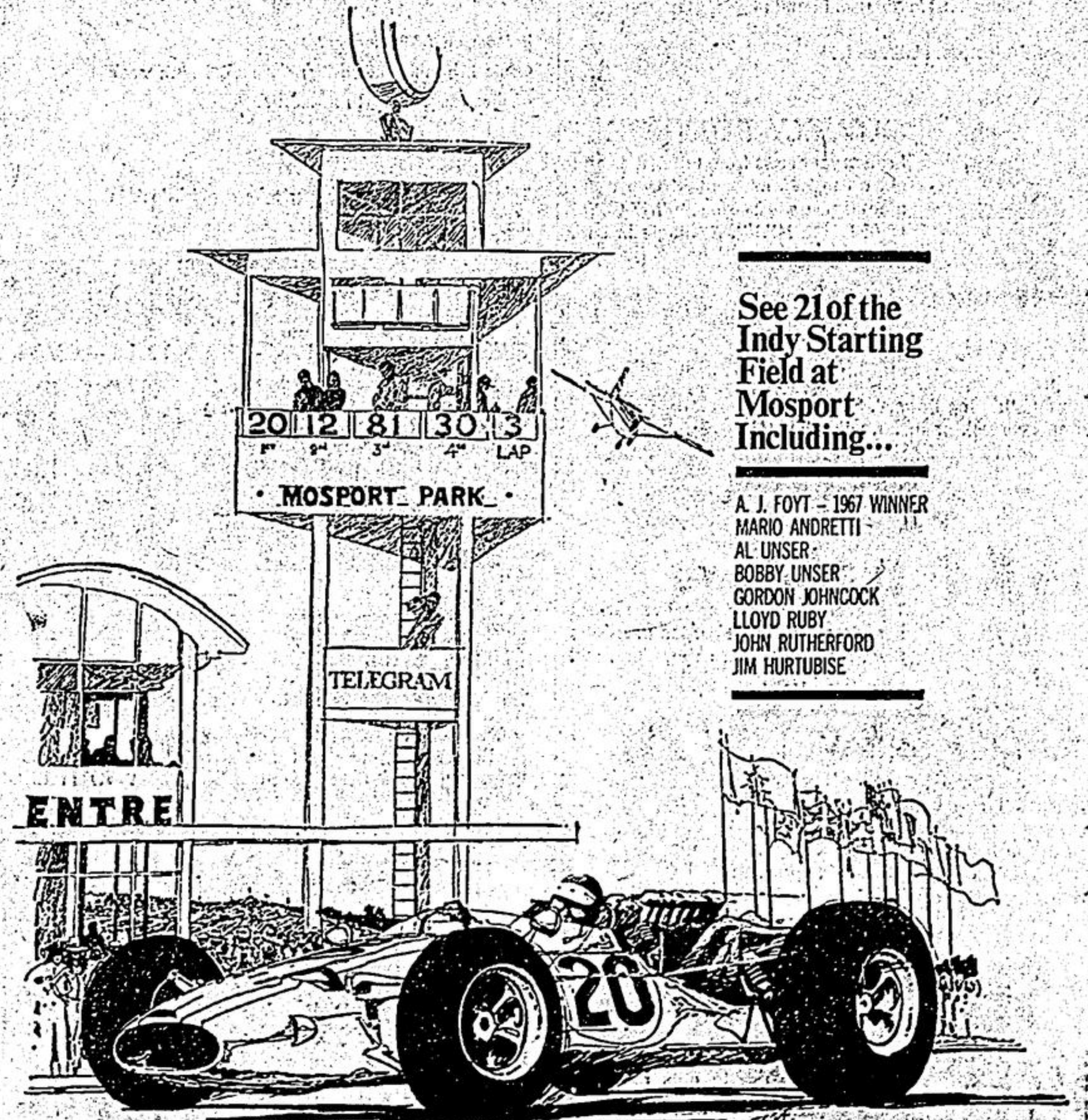
