



Rain Halts Meet Finish Saturday

STOUFFVILLE — It was an inter-school centennial track and field competition on the grounds of St. Mark's, Stouffville, Saturday, but it could have been mistaken for a swim meet.

Athletes from thirteen senior schools in the area slipped and slid their way through more than half the events before rain halted its completion. Students will return this Saturday at nine o'clock.

Only the well-drained sodded field allowed the meet to last until noon. Some felt that it should have been called off even earlier. In one final race, three of the five girls entered fell.

FEW COMPLAINTS — Bare feet were common on the grounds and in spite of the unpleasant elements, few pupils complained. The auditorium at St. Mark's was transformed into a large refreshment booth and "drying out" area. One senior girl, her hair hanging in strings down to her shoulders, looked like she had just climbed out of the pool. "I wish I had brought my bathing suit," she said.

In spite of the field problems, the events were run off almost on schedule. The meet is about two-thirds complete and barring any similar holdups this Saturday, the winners of championship awards should be known by 11 a.m.

Cadieux got off to a rather shaky start when the visitors clipped him for

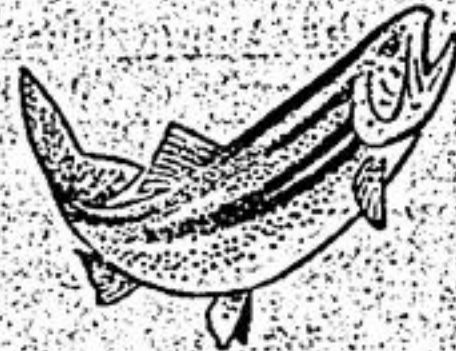
