Opposes Additional Reservoir Charges

PICKERING — Deputy Reeve Mrs. Jean McPherson voted against financing and construction of the reservoir on the basis of deferred benefits charged to a maximum of \$250,000, at a council meeting June 19.

She said that it had definitely been stated that \$200,000 would be the deferred area charge, and she was not in favor of the extra \$50,000 being charged to residents in the area who had no hope of benefiting from a water system for years to come.

Reeve Laycock, Councillors John Williams and Ron Challen said that J. A. Kennedy, Ontario Municipal Board chairman had said that the Board would approve if the township engineer thought it really necessary.

"I get quite accustomed to those rather slanderous and personal remarks made by Mrs. McPherson," said Councillor Williams, "You all heard what Mr. Kennedy said. Mrs. McPherson apparently did not hear this. Because she didn't hear it, she claims it wasn't said."

"I apologize for my 'slanderous' remarks," said the deputy reeve, "But I hear what I hear and nobody can say anything different. You say it is slanderous because I tell the truth."

Mr. Challen said there was no doubt he (Kennedy) said it, and Mrs. McPherson was using the wrong word when she said "slanderous."

"She is indirectly accusing Mr. Williams of lying," he said.

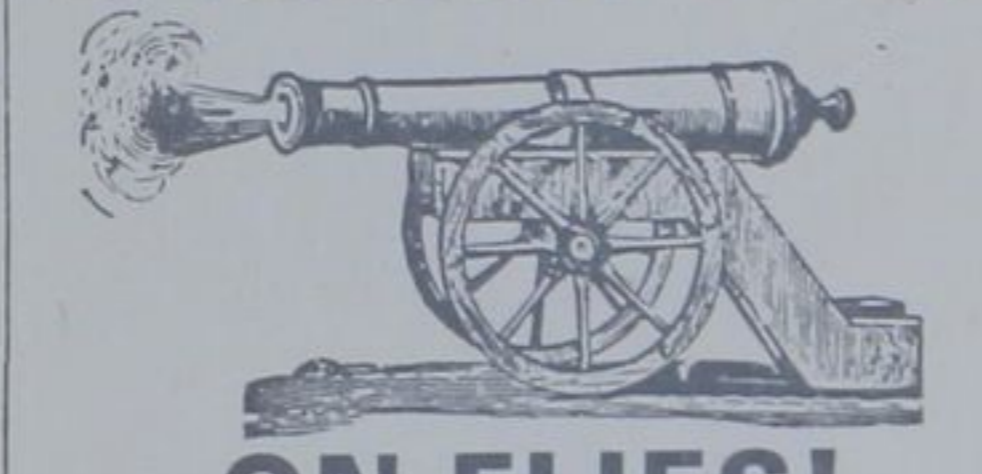
