## Portrait Of A Teenager

STOUFFVILLE — In the Main Street store of Cadieux's Studio, Stouffville, hangs a beautiful framed photograph of Trudy and Michael Cadieux, then aged 3 and 7 years.

Now, thirteen years later, the family of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Cadieux numbers two sons and a daughter. Michael, 20, is employed at I.B.M., Don Mills. Trudy, 16, has just completed Grade 11 at Stouffville District High School and Jimmy, 6, will enter Grade 2 at Summitview Public School in September.

Like most girls in their mid-teens years, the high school is the centre of Trudy's academic, social and athletic interests. She plays on the volleyball and basketball teams and served as vice president of the Curling Club. But her activities extend well beyond the school. Best known in public for her folk-singing talent, she forms one-third of a Stouffville folk group known as 'The Hard Times'. Other members include her brother, Mike and a cousin, Nancy Murphy. They will perform on stage in the afternoon portion of the July 1 program in the Park. The trio had its start when invited to sing at an evening gathering of the United Church Couples Club. They were an immediate success.

### MAKES OWN CLOTHES

Like so many of the teen girls in Stouffville, Trudy makes many of her own clothes. Employed at the Stouffville I.G.A. and, in her spare time, at Sleepy Hollow Golf Course, she uses the money to buy materials. "It's ridiculous to pay \$25 for a dress when you can make it yourself for so much less. That's one of the main reasons so many of the girls are doing it". Trudy has another reason, however. She enjoys doing it and hopes to enroll in a course of either fashion or interior design at Ryerson. As an alternate profession, she would obtain her B.A. degree and teach high school.

Trudy loves to dance and captured the talent award in Stouffville's Centennial Beauty Pageant. She was a runner-up in the same contest and also in the school's May Prom.

Trudy's steady boyfriend is Geoff Gaston an active Stouffville hockey and baseball player. They share many common interests including a love of water sports. She hopes also to improve her golfing game when time allows more practice. She has never played the Sleepy Hollow Course but toured the par 3 at The Willows. She declined to reveal her score. She owns her own set of clubs, a gift from her dad. She has also acquired her 90-day driver's permit. Her dad is the instructor.

Once an avid Beatle-fan, Trudy's enthusiasm for the fabulous foursome has waned somewhat since they went into semi-retirement. Her current favorites are Michael Caine, Julie Christie and Dean Martin.

Trudy is the first to admit that her interests and those of her brothers are also the interests of her parents. It is a closely-knit family circle.
