What Questions Do Women Motorists Ask Most?

According to a survey of salesmen whose business it is to answer the queries of women buyers, gasoline economy and maintenance costs top the list.

These are also the questions most frequently asked of well known women drivers in the annual Mobil Economy Run in their conversations with average women motorists.

A third of the professional drivers summed up her experiences: "Women tend to neglect lubrications, oil changes, tire checks and tune ups because they are busy about mechanics. They are really asking for trouble. I'd suggest they find a reputable dealer and let him schedule their service."

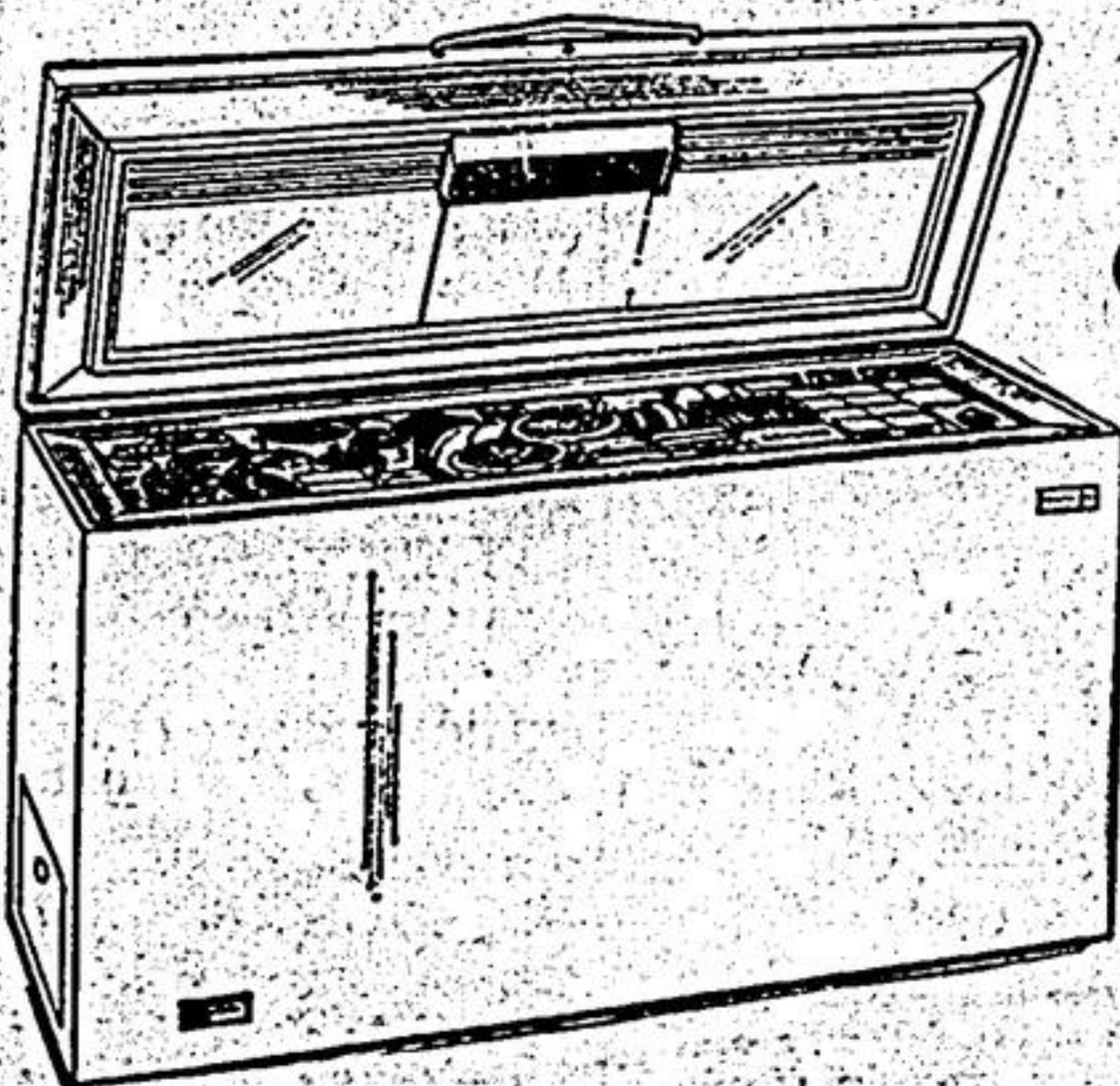

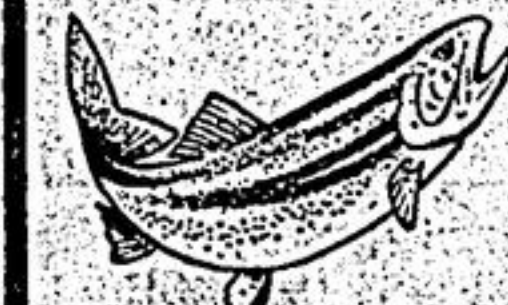
