Would Close Station At Locust Hill-CPR

A proposal by the Canadian Pacific Railways to service all of the Trent Division through a service centre at Agincourt, commencing September 5th, was explained by J. F. Crate, Superintendent of the CPR.

Some weeks ago the CPR announced their intention to withdraw the caretaker from Locust Hill station, and service the area through the Agincourt service centre.

The station would remain open as a shelter for travelling customers, with heat probably looked after by the section man, Mr. Crate said.

Under the service centre arrangement a mobile person, a former agent with a telephone in the car would move about the area and anyone having difficulty could be reached by car within the hour.

Councillor Hoover insisted, "I'd like to hear what the people of the area have to say direct. I will contact some of them myself."

On motion of Councillors Sumner and Roman members agreed to withdraw objections to the proposal for Locust Hill station, and on motion of Councillor Hoover and Deputy-revee S. J. Gadsby they agreed to defer decision for ten days.

Other stations slated for changes under the new service centre systems are Woodbridge, Claremont, Myrtle, Lindsay, Norwood, Bonarlaw, Bala, Orillia, Midhurst, etc.
