On Sunday Mr. and Mrs. W. Empringham entertained Mr. and Mrs. Gibson and Mrs. E. Hunt for dinner.



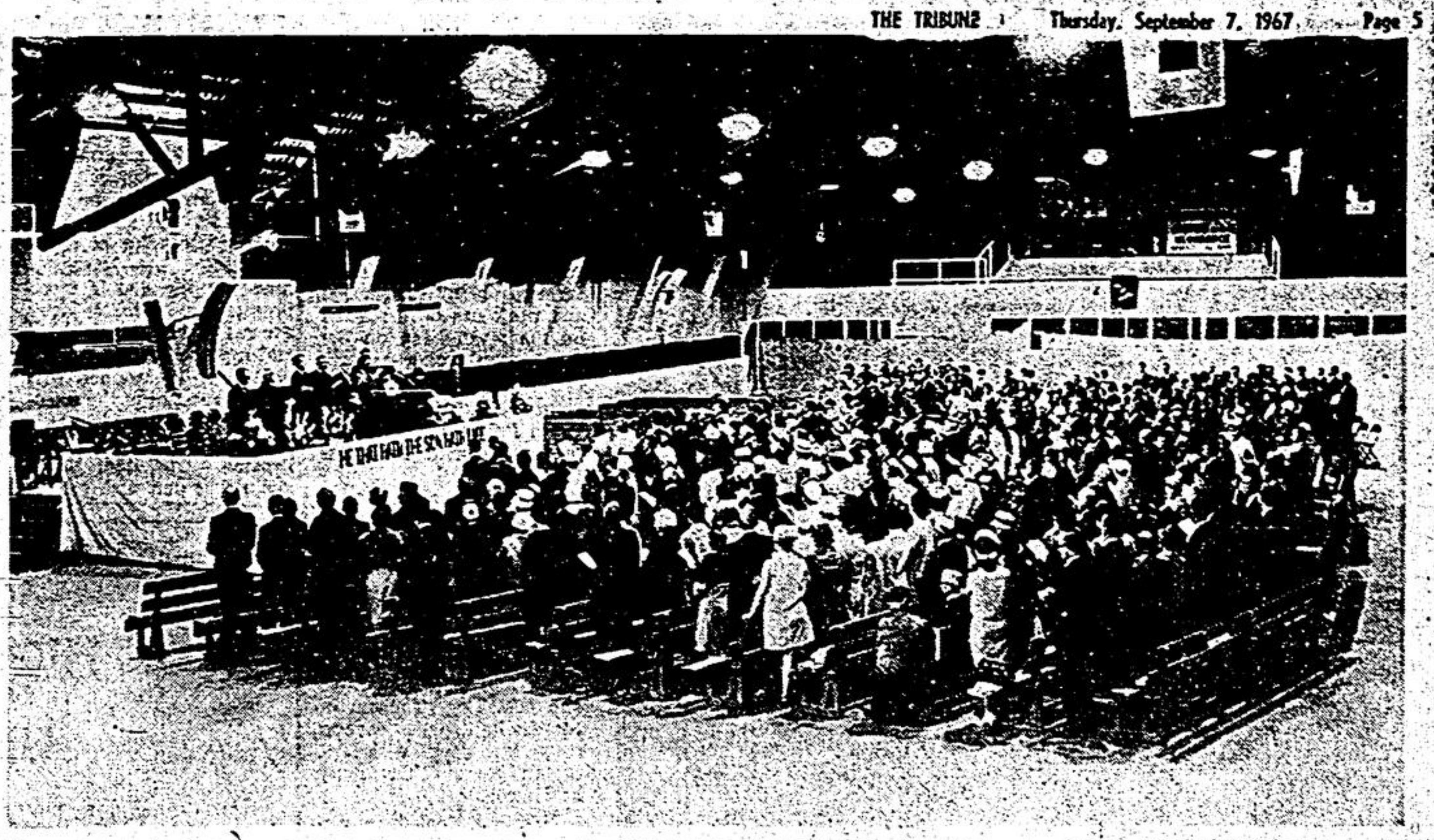

## Lake Conservation 30 Years Behind

Dear Sir: However well intentioned the Whitchurch Conservation Club may be the very word conservation as applied to Whitchurch is both laughable and infuriating.

Whitchurch has been blessed with small lakes which, if considered in the light of their proximity to Metropolitan Toronto were, and could be priceless natural assets.

One, Wilcox Lake, due to abuse, lack of conservation and planning, is a notorious slum.

Our summer cottage at Musselman's is almost surrounded by other cottages occupied on a yearly basis, whose sub-standard, overcrowded living conditions permit and encourage with unbelievable rapidity the transformation of a resort into a slum.

Whitchurch Township's reeve, its council, building inspector, clerk, solicitor, all have been completely ineffectual in dealing with the problem. Letters from summer cottagers, to authorities at Whitchurch are not replied to.

Conservation in Whitchurch is 30 years too late. If the Township's Conservation Club was to dedicate itself to the restoration and reclamation of Lake Wilcox's natural beauty and the enforcement of zoning and land use by-laws at Musselman's as well as conservation, then the club would merit support and respect, not derision.
