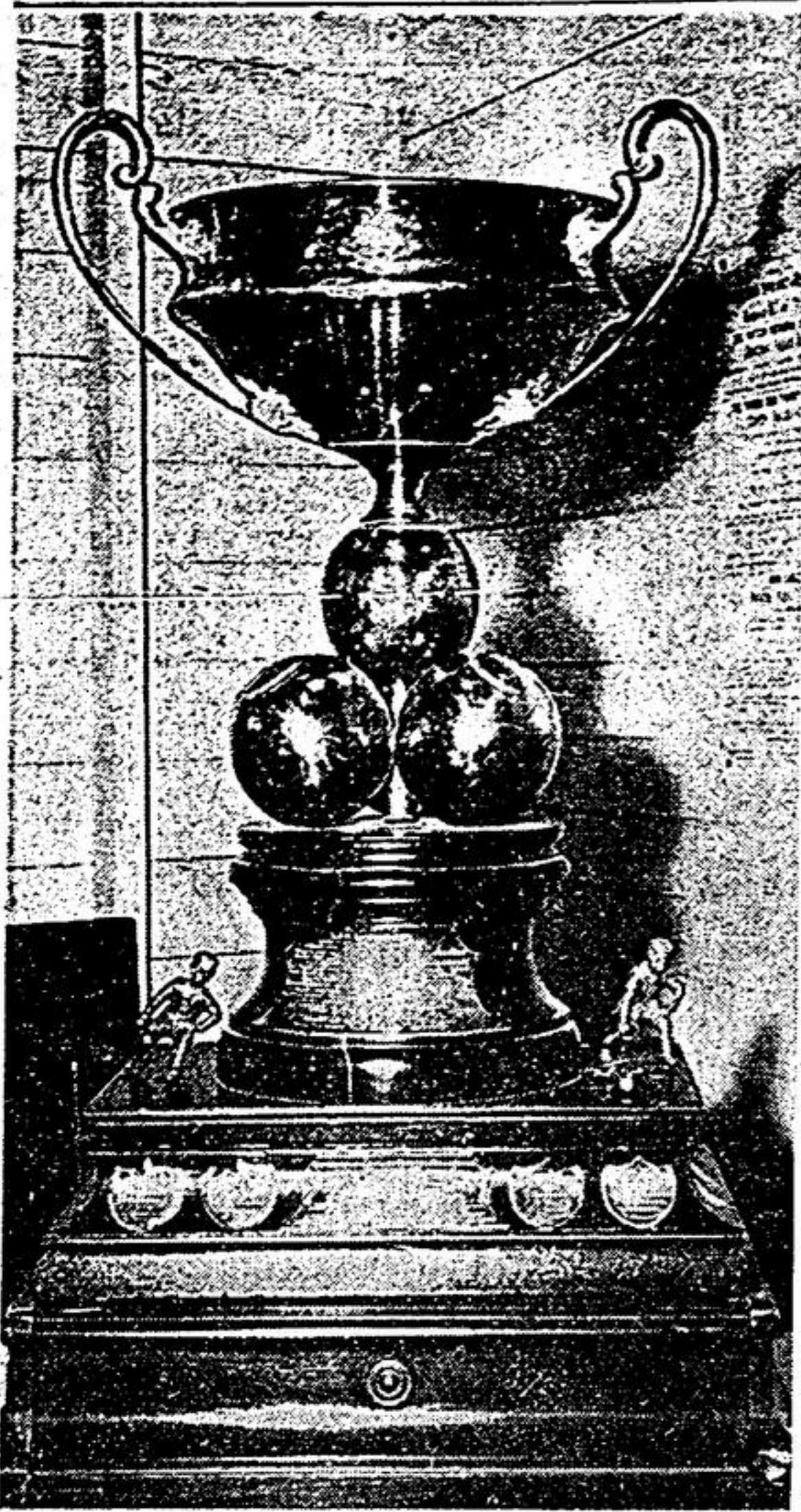


# I.G.A. IN PLAYOFF FINALS

STOUFFVILLE—It is Stouffville vs. Sunderland for the league title and the playoff action all starts on Stouffville's home diamond this Sunday.

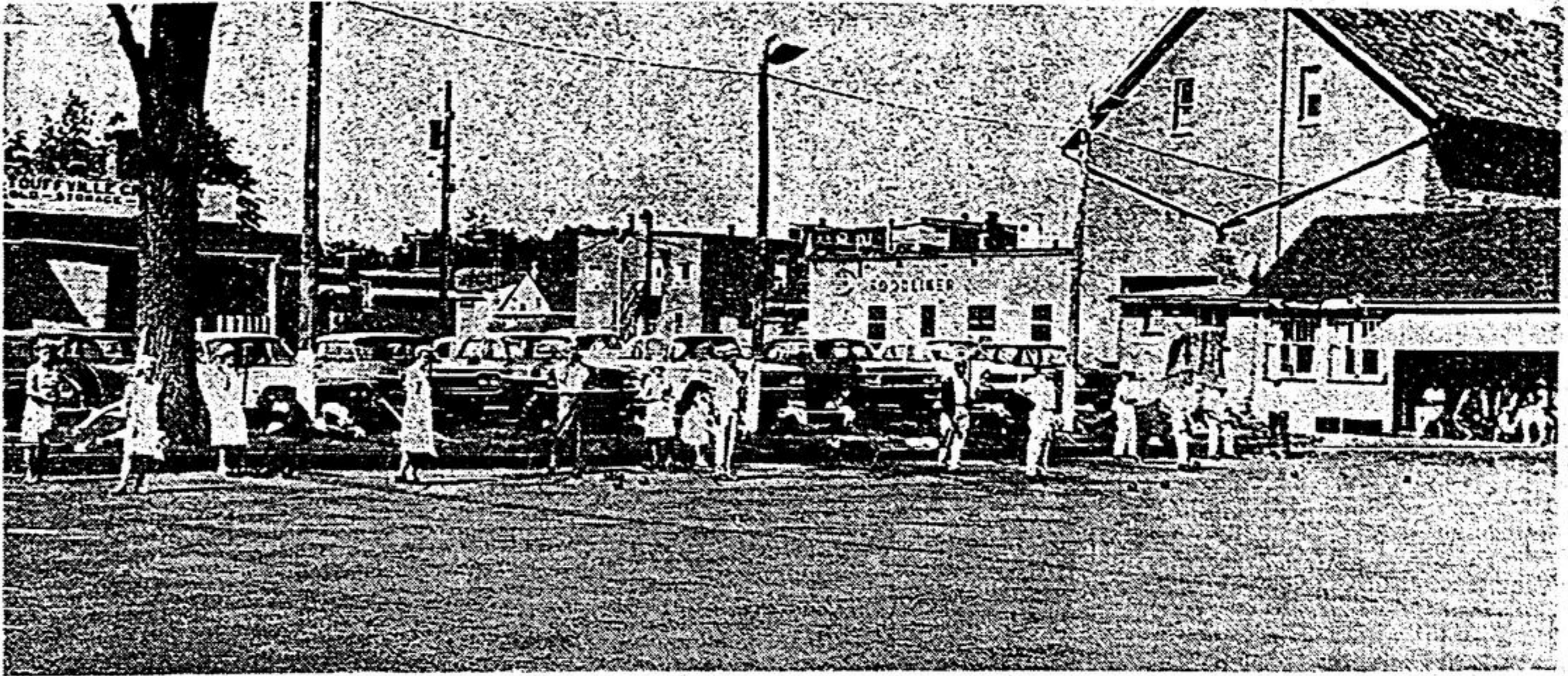
The two teams will squeeze in a doubleheader at 1 p.m. The series is a best 4 out of 7 games. Stouffville I.G.A. has yet to be beaten this season although Sunderland, their current rivals, gave them a couple of close contests.

In the semi-final round, Stouffville breezed past Port Perry by scores of 12-2; 7-0 and 11-10. They made it a clean sweep on Sunday winning on Port Perry's home field.

Sunday's game was a real thriller as Stouffville was forced to come from behind in the late innings. At one point, Port Perry led 9-4. They scored seven of those runs in a big 4th inning when ten men paraded to the plate.

Glenn Jackson was a sensation at bat for Stouffville, hitting four times in four trips. He clouted a pair of doubles and two singles. Dave Slack had three safeties, including two doubles and Larry Spang crashed a home run blow. George McKay poked out a pair, a single and a double. Mike Cadieux was the winning pitcher.

Port Perry led 10-8 as the teams moved into the top of the 8th inning. Roger Todd, Glenn Jackson and Larry Spang crossed the plate, Spang's run breaking the tie. The homesters were held off, the score sheet although they threatened in the 9th and left two men stranded.
