## Cars Jam Roads To Buttonville Airport

**BUTTONVILLE**—Buttonville became the Mosport of the airways last Saturday, as OPP and Township police, assisted by officers from Vaughan, Whitchurch, Markham village and Richmond Hill, struggled with the biggest jam Markham Township has ever seen, when an estimated 60,000 people made their way to the Toronto Airways Centennial Air Show at Buttonville Airport. Sgt. Donald Dukes said he doubted that Markham Fair in its 3-day run would draw as many cars as came to Buttonville in five hours on Saturday. From 9.30 a.m. roads leading to the airport were full, and by 10.30 the back-up on Don Mills Road extended to Hwy. 401.

Deputy-chief Robert Hood, who rode with Eddie Luther in the CFRB helicopter for a time, said even when cars started to move out of the area traffic was still coming in. Officers directing the traffic on the ground were equipped with radios, but these "frizzled out," he said. At any rate, in point of numbers the Air Show was a huge success.

The program included demonstrations of acrobatic flying and sky diving. Featured were T-33 RCAF 2-seater jets, chipmunks, and the loud whining Mustang.

And for veteran World War I pilots there was the nostalgia of a dog fight, with a Fokker tri-plane and Sopwith Pup in eyeball to eyeball combat with bulletless guns chattering and the Fokker wavering off in a trail of smoke.

The Fokker was the plane used by the German airforce in the first world war; the model at the airshow was built from plans captured after the war. These vintage planes had no enclosed cockpit and a very low altitude. There was no radio control, no paved air fields, and no brakes. The craft was stopped by a man at each end of the wing tips.

The lone woman stunt pilot was Canada's only female acrobatic flyer, Sally Wagner of Richmond Hill who has chalked up 3,000 flying hours in performances across the continent. Miss Wagner is a colour technician by profession and left a dancing career to take up flying.

The Markham Township fire truck was on hand, and the St. John's Ambulance, but no accidents or incidents were reported to mark the day, although every so often a report was broadcast that "lost" children might be located at hanger No. 1.

Ground controlled planes operated by members of the Experimental Aircraft Association were demonstrated, and the association announced a show for Saturday and Sunday this week at their field at 14th Ave and the 5th Conc. in Markham Twp.

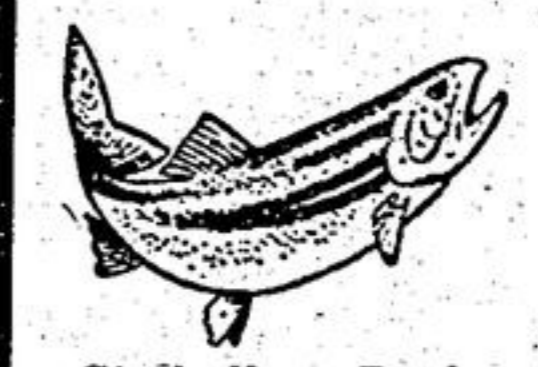

## Notice To Realty TAXPAYERS CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PICKERING

The Council of the Corporation of the Township of Pickering has authorized the establishment of a system of municipal and school tax credits and refunds under the provisions of The Municipal and School Tax Credit Assistance Act, 1967, to assist elderly persons. A tax credit equivalent to one-half of the municipal and school taxes may be allowed in respect of a real property, subject to a maximum of \$150.00 if:

- The owner, and/or the husband or the wife of the owner, is 65 years of age or more and occupies the real property as a personal residence.
- Application is made by the taxpayer during the calendar year in which the realty taxes, in respect of which the tax credit is claimed, become due and payable, and
- The remaining portion of the realty taxes, after the deduction of the tax credit, has been paid.

### TOWNSHIP OF PICKERING

#### Temporary Help Required For Traffic Counting

The Township is currently undertaking a study of all roads and streets so that acceptable programmes of future improvement may be determined.

In approximately sixty locations, it will be necessary to record the movement of vehicles during a four hour period on October 19th between 1:00 P.M. and 5:00 P.M. It is estimated that each person assigned to count vehicles will be required for approximately 8 hours. Two hours on October 18th, from 2:00 to 4:00 P.M. for instruction purposes and 6 hours on October 19th. This time allows for travelling to the assigned station. Applicants for this work will be required to provide their own transportation from the Municipal Offices to the counting station. Payment of 10 cents per mile will be made in addition to the hourly rate.

The work will be quite simple and should appeal to housewives or other persons who could be available at the times indicated. Consideration will be given to residents of the Township on the basis of the date when an application is received.
