**Robarts Government Has Been Ontario's Best Says Hodgson**

**KETTLEBY** — William Hodgson has been active in municipal politics for nineteen years. He has served on the King Township Council, as well as numerous committees outside of his municipal responsibilities.

Mr. Hodgson is of English-Scottish descent and a long-time resident of King Township, as were his parents. He is 58 years old, the son of Chris Hodgson and Annie Chamberlain of Nobleton. He married the former Eliza Barker of Temperanceville in 1936 and they have four children, Beth, a University of Toronto graduate, now Mrs. Wayne McClellan of Pottageville; Janice, an employee of the Imperial Bank of Commerce; Bob, a civil engineer and David, a student at the University of Western Ontario.

Mr. Hodgson has owned and operated his dairy farm in the Kettleby district for the past twenty-nine years. He is a former president of District Seven Milk Producers. For the past four years he has been chairman of the King Township Planning Board, and for the past two years chairman of the Court of Revisions in the seven Municipalities of York County. He has been a director of York County Hospital for some years and a director of the Childrens Aid Society.

William Hodgson entered municipal life in 1949 and served a total of thirteen years on the King Township Council; three as a councillor, three as deputy reeve, and seven as reeve. In 1959 he was elected Warden of York County.

Mr. Hodgson has been a long-time member of the York North Progressive Conservative Association and is presently the president of York North Provincial Association. In 1963 he helped to re-elect Major Lex MacKenzie to the Provincial Legislature by acting as his campaign manager.

**HIS PLATFORM**

Mr. Hodgson is now seeking to represent York North as the Progressive Conservative candidate in the October election and he puts forth the following points in his platform. (1) Relieve landowners of education costs. (2) Establish a York North commuter service. (3) No change in local government system. (4) Hard look at any sales tax increase.

Enlarging on these points Mr. Hodgson told the Tribune that the main issue is that owners of real estate should be relieved of the major share of paying the cost of education.

He favours increased Provincial grants to schools and approves of the recommendation in the Smith Report that calls for a \$2,000 assessment exemption on land.

He stated that now is the time to start a north-south commuter service, it is badly needed and will press for such service if he is elected.

Mr. Hodgson wants no change in present form of local government and favours the system where elected representatives are

close to the people who elect them.

In regards to sales tax, Mr. Hodgson backs Premier Robart's stand that no increases should be made this year.

Still a young man, William Hodgson has compiled an impressive record of public service. He has always been motivated by his desire to serve diligently those constituents who had placed their trust in him and in doing so has shown himself as a conscientious man with the ability to represent his electors to the limit of his proven resources and considerable energies.
