Organize Ratepayers Association

GOODWOOD—On Wednesday, October 18, a group of 30 ratepayers from the Township of Uxbridge assembled in the home of Mr. S. D. Walder, Conc. 4 Uxbridge, with a view to forming a Ratepayers Association. This move was prompted by the need for an organized group to represent Township of Uxbridge Ratepayers with the many problems within the Township which they feel are not being adequately attended to, or in some cases, completely overlooked by Township Council.

With unanimous approval, it was agreed that such a group be formed and, subject to investigation and approval, be known as The Township of Uxbridge Ratepayers Association. A provisional steering committee was elected to hold office for a six month period, following which, elections would be held at twelve monthly periods, when it is hoped a more cross section of the population will be represented. Those elected were S. D. Walder, President; R. L. Adkin, Secretary - Treasurer, and L. Hawkridge, K. Barrie, A. J. Bailey, Executive Committee members.

Interested persons were present from an area between Concessions two and five, including the Village of Goodwood. A

further meeting has been arranged for Wednesday, November 1st, however, the location of this meeting has yet to be arranged as a problem exists in regard to the number of people it is expected will attend. It is known that another group of interested Ratepayers were present at the Township Council meeting on October 10th and it is hoped these, as well as any other interested residents will contact either Ron Adkin at 852-3574 or Scott order to discuss mutual Walder at 852-6456, in interests.

The immediate problems confronting the steering committee are the drawing up of a constitution, membership fees (which will be purely nominal), obtaining a complete set of existing bylaws and summarization of various complaints known at this time.

It was noted that there is to be one further Township Council meeting November 13, prior to elections, and a delegation from the newly formed association is expected to request a meeting with Council at that time.
