Comment Is Stricken From County Record

NEWMARKET — North Willimbury Reeve, Joseph Dales, always one to speak his mind, had a few words to say at York County Council, last week, on receipt of a police report, prepared by Committee Chairman, Bill Parsons, deputy-reeve of Stouffville. Mr. Parsons was not present and the report was read by the committee secretary, deputy-reeve Ken McTaggart of King.

Reeve Dales expressed irritation over a comment in Mr. Parsons' written submission that he felt tended to intimate cowardice on the part of the members of the County security police.

The statement referred to an "invasion" of motorcyclists from Metro and the call for assistance from the County force. "Presumably, it convinced one of the Security Police that there was a safer place to be than on the force, for one of them re-

signed immediately" the report read.

Reeve Dales charged that such a remark is written into the County records for all time and he resented the insinuation that the officer had quit because he was afraid. He charged that there was no proof that such was the case.

Reeve Ken Laushway of Stouffville moved that this portion of the report be deleted.

Whitchurch Township Police reported that a panel truck driven by Vincenzo Panacci of Toronto was travelling north

when it collided with a car driven by Bruce Cryderman, 25 of Newmarket. The panel truck after striking the car veered across the road striking a Dodge dump truck, driven by James Foster of Newmarket.

Ten passengers, all To-

ronto school workers were in the panel truck. In the car besides Mr. Cryderman were Christine Smith, 18, Eileen Muirison, 63 and Edna Bowman, 41, all of Newmarket.

Police said that when they arrived on the scene, they found people lying all over the road. It was a miracle that none were killed," said an officer.

Police later charged Panacci with dangerous driving.
