'Heated' OMHA Meeting

STOUFFVILLE — In a stormy session on Saturday, November 4, the O.M.H.A. annual convention approved the new age limits for minor hockey league players set last May by the C.A.H.A. The new age qualifications, which go into effect for the 1968-69 season are: Juvenile — after Dec. 31, 1950; Midget — after Dec. 31, 1952; Bantam — after Dec. 31, 1954; Pee Wee — after Dec. 31, 1956; Novice — after Dec. 31, 1958.

Feelings ran high as the delegates listened to the opinions for and against the proposed change. A motion, proposed by the Milton Minor Hockey Association, which would have made the O.M.H.A. an outlaw league, was defeated by a two thirds vote. It was the feeling of the delegates that they could better fight the age change by remaining within organized hockey and the O.M.H.A. executive was instructed to press for the return of the present age groups at the next C.A.H.A. convention in May.

Opposition to the change centered on the fact that it will reduce the number of boys eligible for minor hockey. This will be especially true of the Juvenile group next year when approximately 3,000 boys will lose one year of eligibility because of the change. Unless more Junior teams are to be formed most of these boys will be finished with organized hockey.

The convention, held at the King Edward Hotel in Toronto was attended by 650 delegates and visitors. It was the largest annual meeting in the 34 year history of the association. Those representing Stouffville were Earl Crowder, Bill Barry, Wilf Morley, Percy Schell and Keith Sutherland.

MARKHAM — Eric Johnson, Markham's outstanding senior runner sprinted to a victory in the Ontario High School Cross Country Championships at Hamilton, Saturday. Johnson, a member of the York Pioneer Track Club also led the Markham District High School to the team championship in a race which featured over 250 athletes and 40 teams. Also running excellent races for Markham's team victory were Malcolm Smith (20th) of the Toronto Olympic Club, John DeFinney (27th), Bruce Theakston (28th), and Gary McNulty (31st) all of the York Track Club.

As well as the exceptional performances by Johnson and his teammates, Derek Gresham of Stouffville and the York Pioneer Track Club finished fourth in a field of 325 runners. Mike DeGrande of Newmarket and the Pioneers placed 23rd. Andre Blackwell (47th), Peter Sanderson (50th), and Joe Madeiros (57th) all of Stouffville should have given their school a fourth place team finish in the team competition, but confusion at the finish resulted in their not receiving the correct position tickets. Larry Wilson and Steve Lloyd, York Pioneer runners from Newmarket High School finished a strong race in 51st and 56th positions in this event.

Another York Pioneer runner, Glen Greenslade of Aurora finished second in a field of 350 in the Midget race.

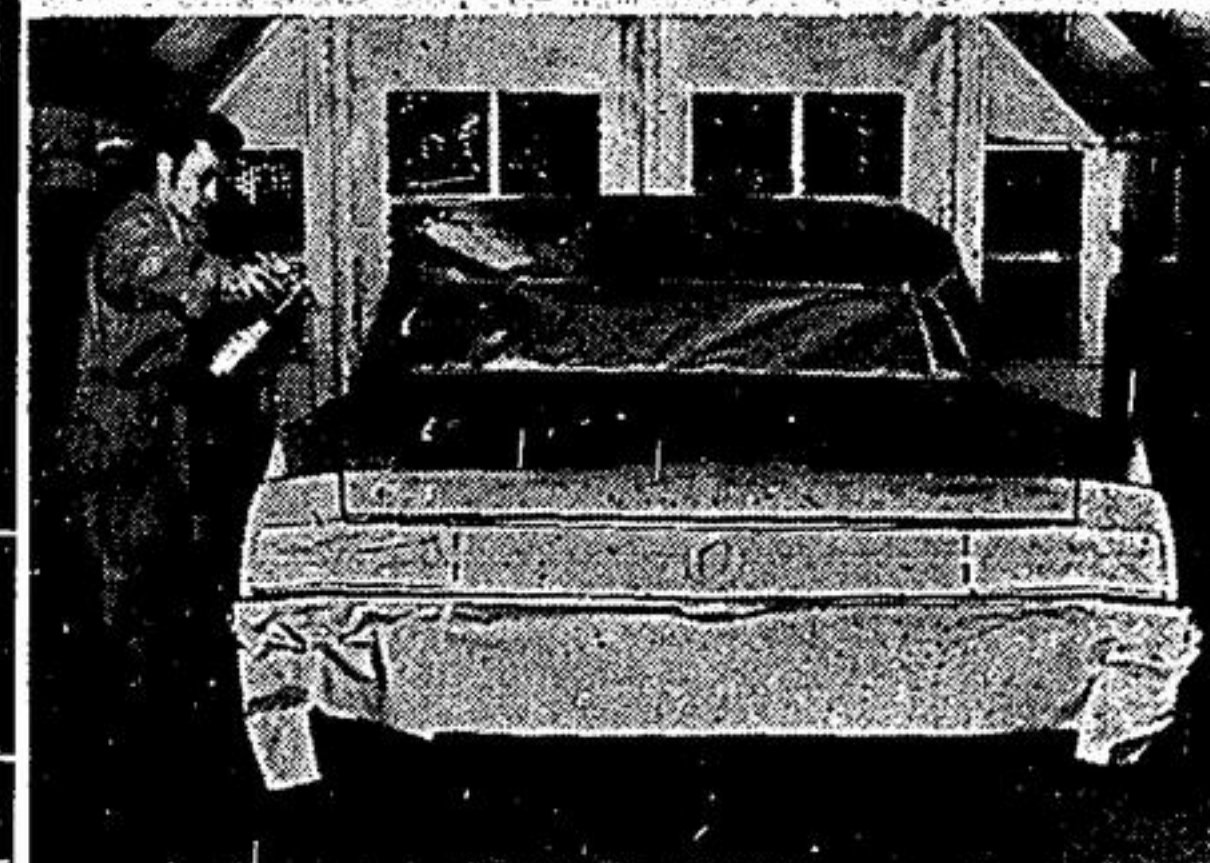
