**Youth To Stand Trial**

RICHMOND HILL — A grand jury has returned a true bill on a non-capital murder charge against a 17-year old Richmond Hill youth.

Robert James Beatty is charged with the murder and manslaughter of Tavo Kapsi, 31, a University of Toronto assistant professor of architecture.

Mr. Kapsi was killed August 27 near his Lake Wilcox cottage shortly after

ter a group of teenagers drove onto a field surrounding his property.

A 54-inch stick sharpened at both ends and found near the scene is believed to be the murder weapon.

Beatty, who has been in jail since August 28, has been released on \$10,000 property bail.

Defense counsel Alfred Stong of Richmond Hill, is attempting to have the murder charge reduced to

manslaughter. An application has been made to the Supreme Court of Ontario.
