Vanishing Automobile Dealer

When this year's crop of new cars arrived in dealers' showrooms throughout the U.S., they were greeted by 671 fewer automobile dealers than last year's

This represented a decline from 27,896 dealers throughout the country a year earlier. This loss during the '67 model year was greater than the 520 auto retail businesses that went down in 1966 or the 215 the year earlier. The present number rep-

resents a decline of 42.8 percent in 18 years. What is causing this trend to fewer and larger dealerships while the number of automobiles sold increases steadily? Mostly, it is dwindling or non-existent profits. Ex-

pense greater than the dealer realizes in the form of retail preparation, sales expense, supervision and free service after the sale make dealerships go broke while they were seemingly making a profit on the car sale. Industry figures for the first three months of this year show that new car dealers before taxes earned an average profit of 2.1 percent. About four out of every ten earned less and 16 percent operated at a net loss.

If a dealer tries to remedy this situation by cutting corners on customer service, his future sales suffer. It his prices are not competitive with the lowest, his current sales volume declines. Dealers who survive and grow maintain rigid cost
