Dental Health Program

PICKERING — A dental health program has been established by the Ontario County Health Unit. This has recently been expanded to provide free preventive services for pre-school children 20 months and over who may have a dental examination at the Child Health Clinic in your area. This is carried out by a qualified dental hygienist. Although no treatment is involved at this clinic tests may be done to determine the speed at which dental decay can develop. Parents will be advised to

take their children to the family dentist for early treatment where this is indicated. A topical fluoride clinic will be opened in December at the branch office in Uxbridge. Parents who wish their pre-school children (3 to 5 years of age) to receive topical applications of fluoride may either phone the Uxbridge office (852-6091) or arrange an appointment with the dental hygienist attending the Child Health Clinics at Clarendon, Port Perry or Zephyr.
