

Rev. Harold Boadway To Speak In Markham

The Rev. Harold Boadway, formerly of Stouffville, will be the guest speaker for the 90th Anniversary Services of the Markham United Missionary Church, next Sunday, November 26. Mr. Boadway who will be speaking in the morning at 11 a.m. and in the evening at 7.30 p.m. has been pastor of the Breslau United Missionary Church since 1957. He received his public and high school education in Stouffville, is a graduate of the Toronto Bible College, and for several years has been on the faculty of the Emmanuel Bible College in Kitchener. His wife, the former Olive Johnston, was also a native of Stouffville. Special music on this Anniversary Sunday will be provided in the morning service by the Girls Choir under the direction of Mrs. Eric Pilkey. In the evening service the Sacred Song Quartette from Kitchener will be in attendance. Ninety years ago the original U.M. Church in Markham which was 30' by 50' in size was built at a cost of \$1,130.00 plus the cost of the bricks. The building committee at that time was composed of Joseph Ramer, Benjamin S. Reesor, Simon Raymer, A. Wideman and James Clendening. In 1960 an addition equal to the size of the original church was built at a cost of \$50,000.00. Since then additional land has been bought to increase the parking space and now plans for another 30 by 40 Christian Education addition are in the hands of contractors. 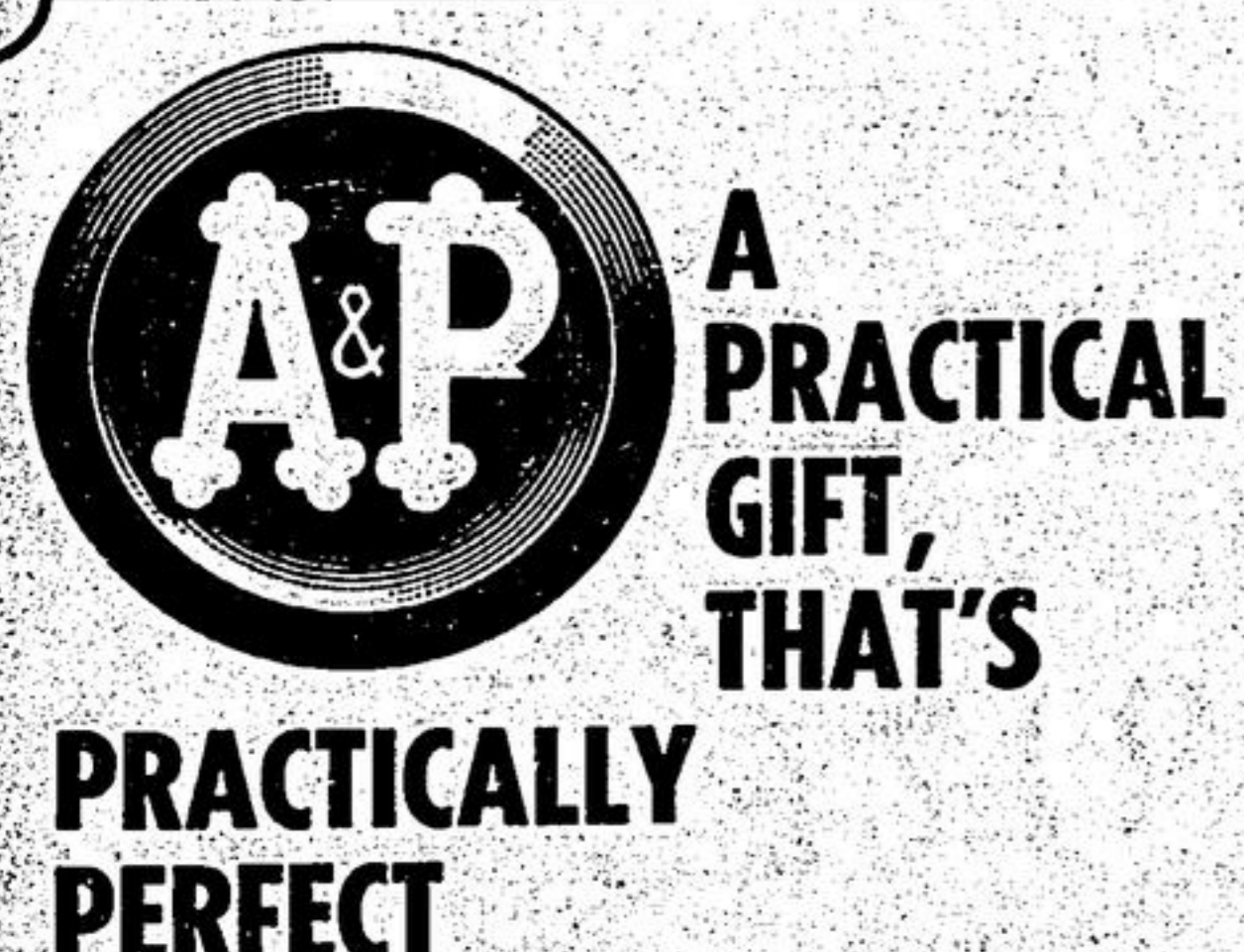
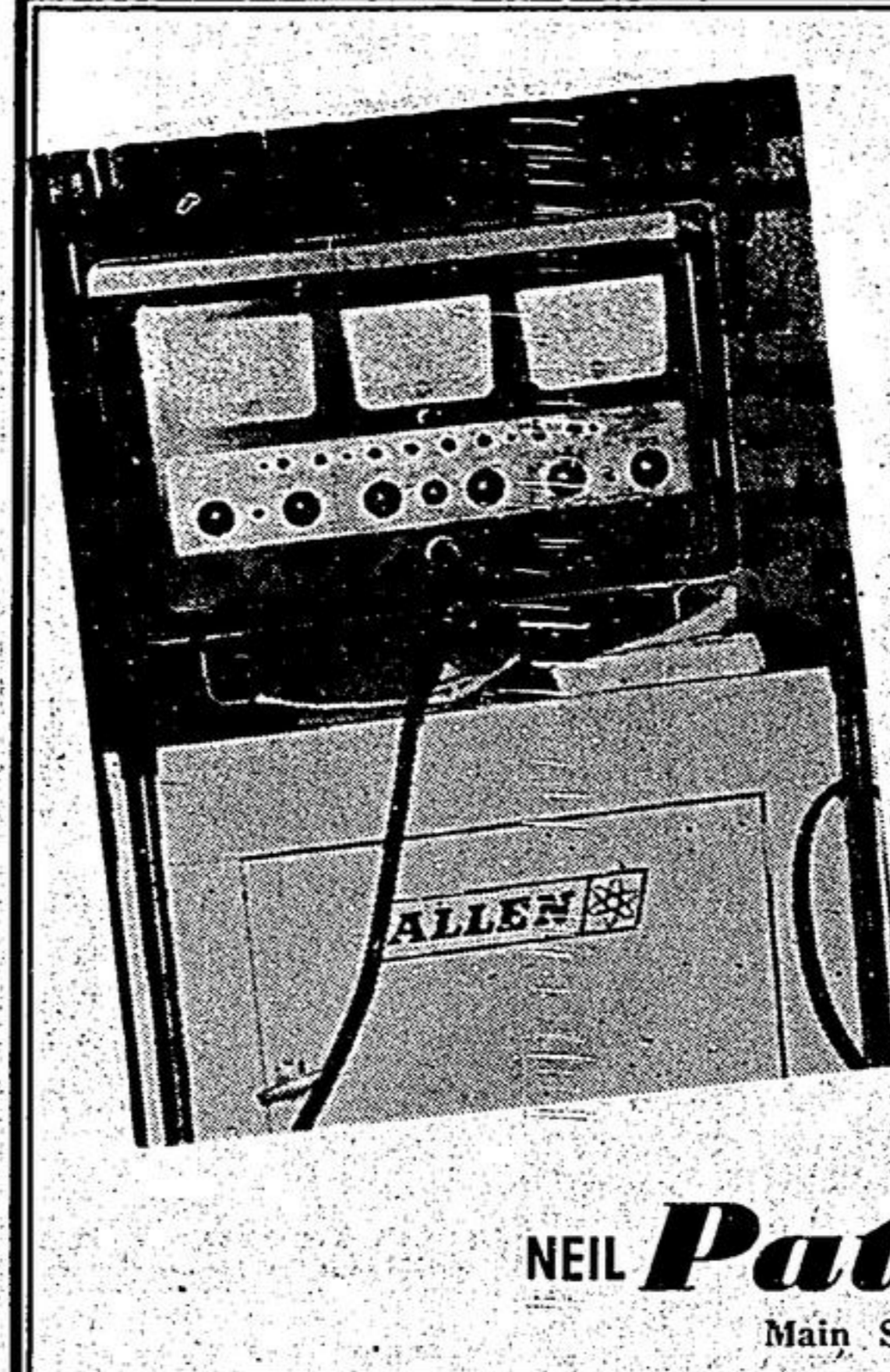
