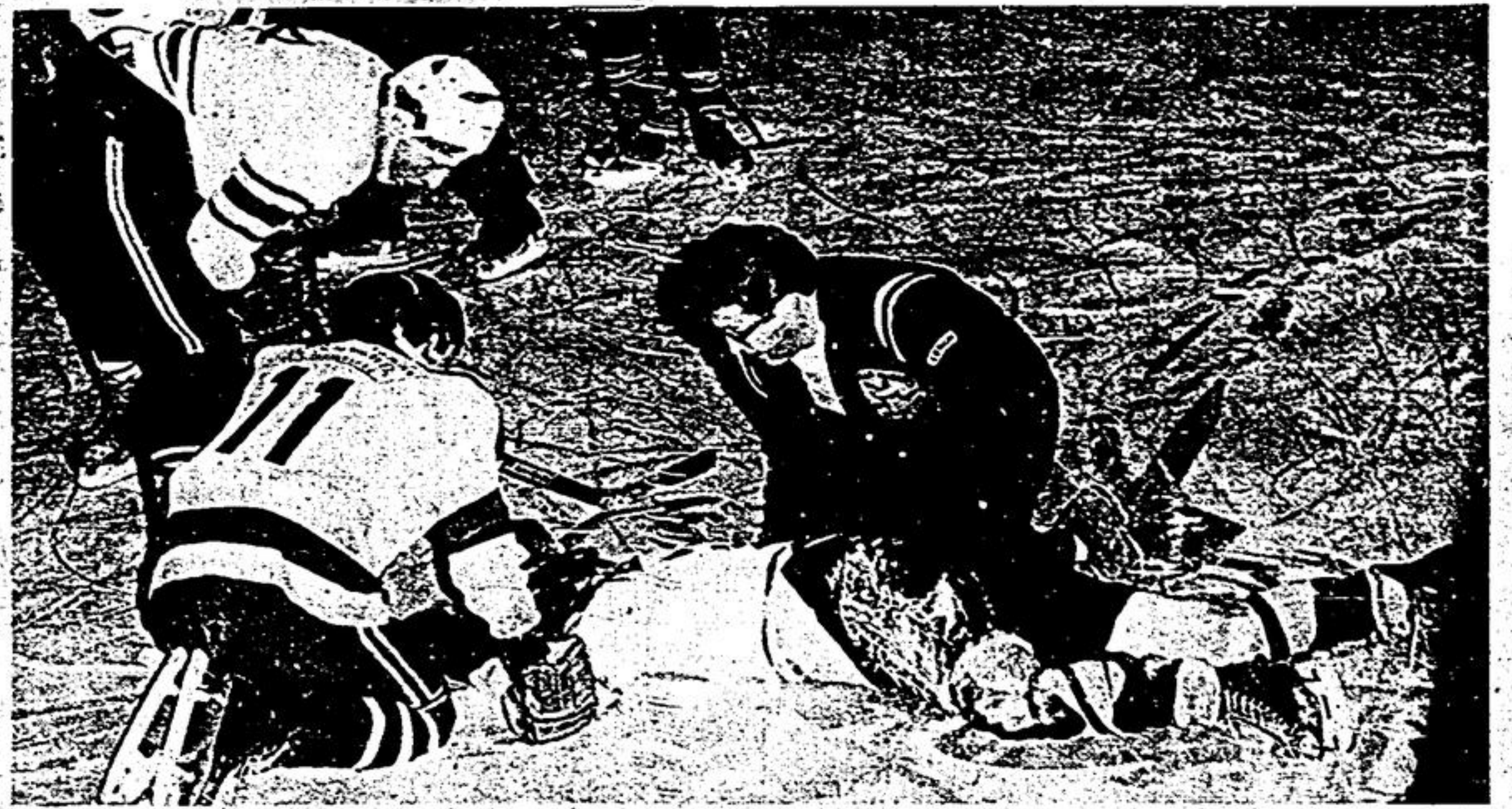
It was an uphill battle for Stouffville all the way. They had to come from behind twice to square the count.
