Late Harry Carter

Dies At Fort William

FORT WILLIAM — Harry Carter, 74, of Fort William, died Dec. 25 following a short illness. He had been in hospital for three weeks.

Born in Nottawasaga township, Simcoe County, the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Carter, he was brought to the Fort William area as a small child when the family homesteaded what is now Carter's Corners on Hwy. 17.

He completed his education in Fort William schools and then began a lengthy career of sailing on the Great Lakes, becoming a captain on grain vessels. He worked for N. M. Paterson and Sons, Ltd., then on the Eastrich, retiring as captain on the Great Lakes Lumber and

Shipping Company tugs rafting saw logs and pulp wood. Following his retirement he was associated with a son-in-law in operation of the Fort William Hatchery until 1965.

Mr. Carter was married to the former Myrtle Hisey of Stouffville, New Year's Day, 1918. They would soon have celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. He was an adherent of Knox United Church and a former member of Fort William Lodge, Loyal Order of the Moose.

He is survived by his widow, at home; one daughter Doris (Mrs. John Chomut); five grandchildren; a brother, Fred and a sister, Miss Emily Carter.
