Trailing 4-3, with one man in the penalty box and only two minutes left in the game, Bill Thornhill of the Stouffville Juveniles scored two goals in twenty seconds to beat West Rouge 5-4.

Thornhill, a three-goal marksman for the night, took a pass from Larry Norton to park the puck behind a startled West Rouge netminder. That made it 4-4. Seconds later, he wheeled away again on a clean-cut break to score easily. That was the winner.

The winger, on a first-string line with Jim Wilkins and Kent Winterstein was mobbed by his mates and jubilant supporters as the final whistle sounded. For Stouffville, it was their seventh straight victory. For the number one line, it was another eight scoring points, tops in the entire league. Wilkins and Winterstein were the other goal getters.

Harold Crowder started in the nets for the homesters but was injured mid-way through the contest and was replaced by Tom McFadden. Both played well.
