Bobcaygeon Club Gains Revenge On 'Clippers'

Holden Stars Despite Loss

STOUFFVILLE — On Jan. 5, Stouffville "Clippers" defeated Bobcaygeon 6-4 right in their home rink. It marked the first time in four years that the local squad had accomplished such a feat. On Tuesday, the 'Caygeon crew gained a measure of revenge when they whipped the "Clippers" 7-3 on Stouffville ice. The victory bounced them back into first place in the league standing.

The "Clippers" played below par with only Jody Holden giving the home-town fans anything to shout about. He put on a sensational one-man show, scoring two goals and missing by inches on several other chances. His tireless effort was praised by the visitors' management.

Holden's first tally came when he out-skated two defencemen and caught the corner with a drive. On his second, he blocked a clearing attempt with his glove and flicked a quick wrist shot into the twine. Blair Wagg was the other Stouffville marksman.

Bobcaygeon's Sterling Bowins counted a hat-trick for the winners. Mike Hannivan scored one goal and assisted on three others.

Bobcaygeon used a Juvenile class goaltender and he played well although, with the exception of the first period, was not over-worked. Dennis Forsyth, on the other hand, was a "sitting duck" on several goals as Bobcaygeon forwards broke in all alone.

In the next two games, the "Clippers" engage Lakefield in a home and home duel, up there on Saturday and back in Stouffville next Tuesday.

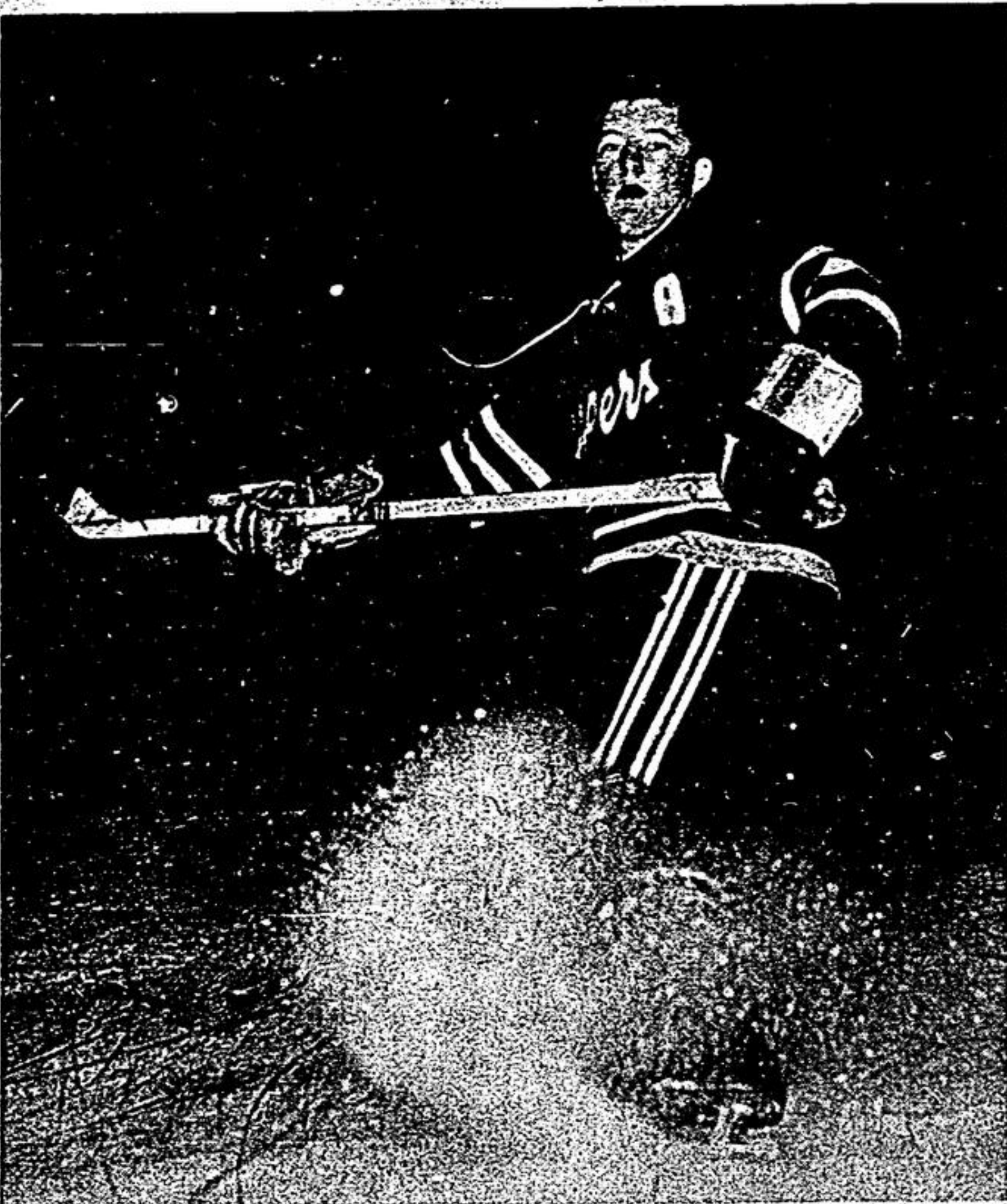
