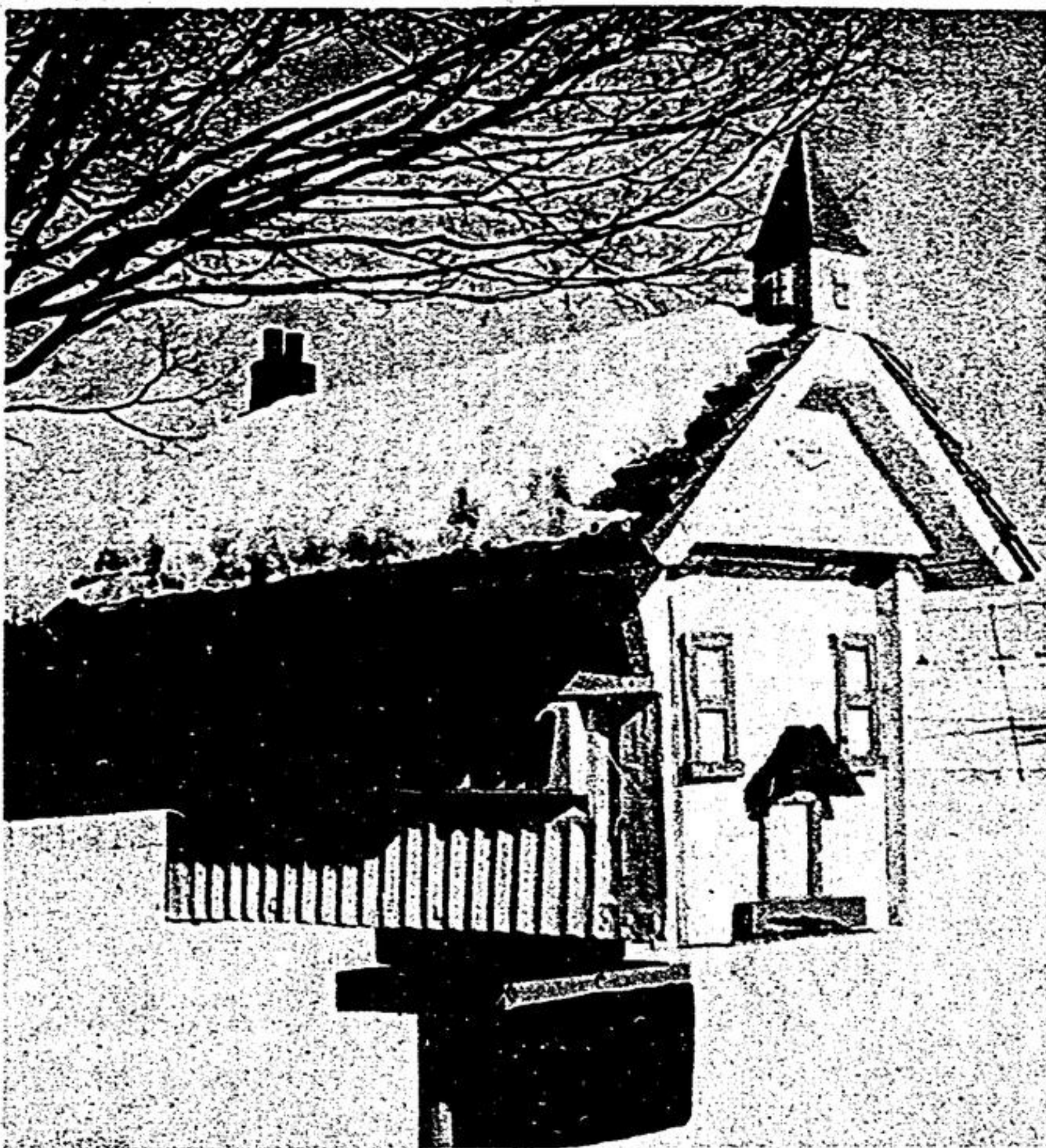


Basketballer Breaks Hand

Discuss Regional Government

PICKERING — A committee of Pickering Township Council has been established to discuss regional government with other municipalities. Membership will be comprised of council in committee of the whole and its name shall be called "The Regional Government Study Group." Councillor John Kruger, who moved the motion to form the committee, said that there had been many ideas expressed in the Oshawa to Metro Toronto municipalities, and they would take a lot of study, a lot of research and a lot of exploring. It would be good for Ajax, Pickering Village, and others, he said, to do the same. "We may wake up some morning," he said, "and find that the province has legislated something not to our best interests. We need to have an active, dynamic voice," he said. "Now it's Oshawa and Whitby. It's time we all sat down and talked about this problem." He said that citizens had a role to play in this — a really, democratic enterprise. "Once we have all determined what our stand should be, then we'll go out and fight for it." Councillor Donald Kitchen said he didn't think it necessarily true that Pickering was going to be part of the Oshawa area. As far as communication, transportation and culture are concerned, there was a link with Toronto. He said 90 per cent of the people worked in Toronto, read Toronto newspapers, followed Toronto elections. "We don't very often get enthused about Oshawa elections," he said, and added that he thought it quite logical for Pickering to be annexed to the Metro area.
