The ladies' complaints, which the magazine felt were more candid because no men were involved, mostly centred around poor service and warranty treatment.

Real or imagined, many of the women drivers believed they were discriminated against on service because they were women. Their description of vehicle symptoms, for instance, tended to be ignored, they said.

The greatest single feature praised on their present cars was the automatic transmission and the most desired future improvement was a rear window defogger.

Mr. and Mrs. Earl Hoover, O'Brien Avenue, called on Mrs. Flora Urquhart of Galt on the weekend.

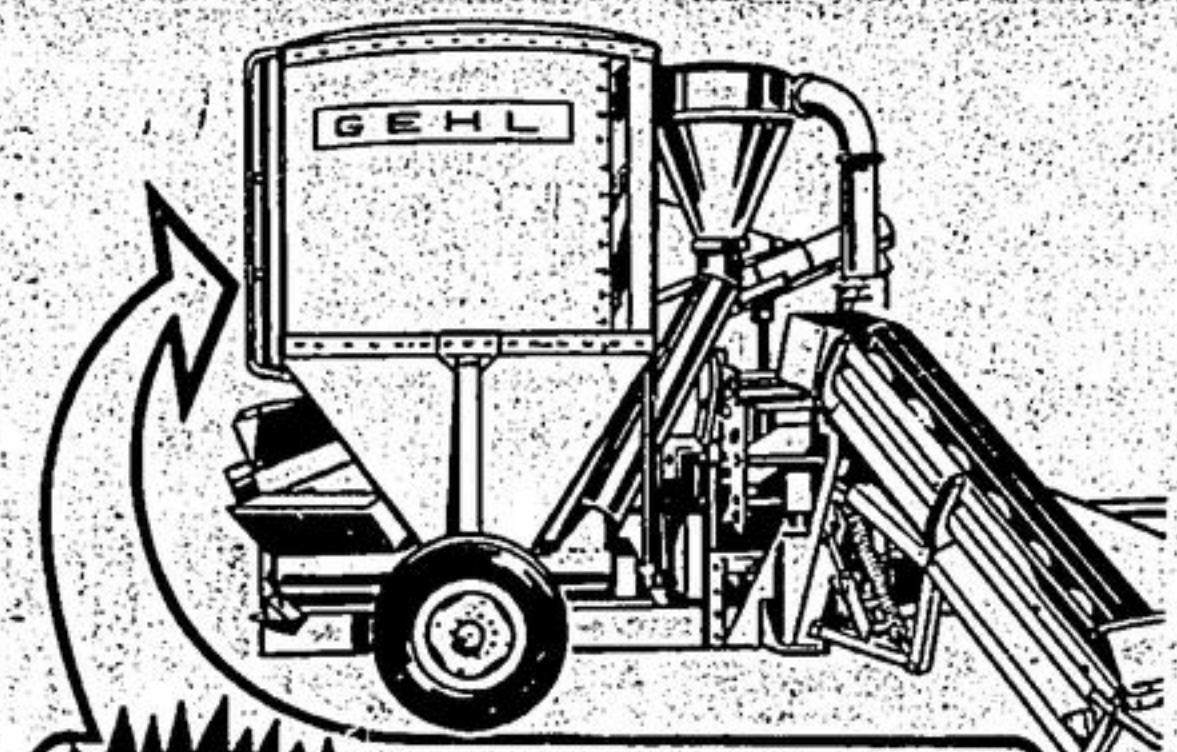
Family Fun Day
