The World Day of Prayer for the Greenwood charge will be held in Kinsale Church on Friday, March 1, at 2 p.m.

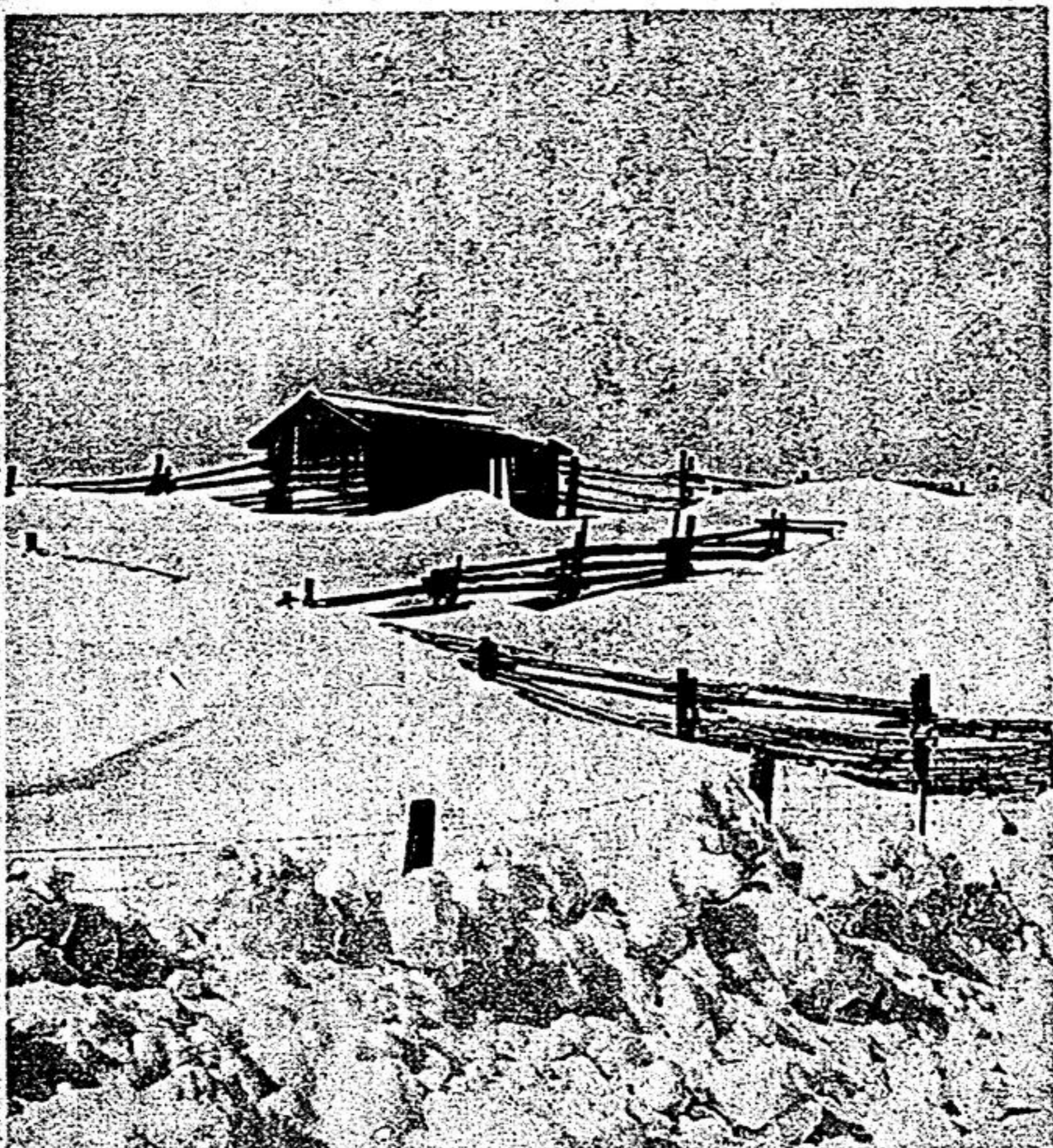

\$110,000 in budget for Stouffville dam

STOUFFVILLE—Of the \$220,500 budget figure of the Metro Toronto and Region Conservation Authority, \$110,000 is for the Stouffville flood control dam and reservoir currently under construction. The total budget approved by the 55-man board for 1968, totals \$2,960,000. In addition to the Stouffville project other monies are for conservation areas development, acquisition of more land and continuing development of Pioneer Village.

It is anticipated that the Ontario Government will contribute more than \$1,330,000 in grants towards the general budget. Per capita cost amounts to less than 45 cents based upon an estimated population of slightly over two million persons within the 1,000-square-mile Authority watershed.

The Authority also approved the capital works budget for the long-term flood control and water conservation program, which over the next three years envisages the expenditure of \$9½-million. Costs of the program is being shared by the federal and provincial governments and the Authority.

Included in the 1968 flood control and water conservation program is \$1,087,000 for channel improvements, erosion control measures and engineering studies affecting the Humber and Don rivers, Highland and Massey creeks in Metro Toronto and the Etobicoke creek and Mains creek in

Brampton. These projects will be undertaken as approved by the municipalities concerned.
