# School clubs organized

Smokers Anonymous is operating in the elementary schools of Lindsay. Teachers are organizing the groups in their classrooms in an effort to help young addicts kick the cigarette habit. Doctors and others knowledgeable about the health hazards of cigarette-smoking have been invited to sit in on the group therapy sessions.

Membership in the groups is restricted to students with a genuine desire to quit smoking and

attendance is voluntary. Membership is anonymous because many of the students do not want their parents to know that they are addicted smokers.

The smokers' clinics are part of an eight-month educational campaign being conducted in Lindsay by a local group, known as the Co-ordinating Committee on Smoking and Health. The committee is supported by the Ontario Medical Association, the Ontario Heart Foundation and the Canadian Cancer Society.

Primary purpose of the project is to determine the value of public educational campaigns. Attitudes of people in Lindsay, both adult and juvenile, towards cigarette smoking were assessed through a public opinion survey, and will be compared with the attitudes reflected in a re-survey in November, following an intensive educational campaign in newspapers, radio, television, in the schools and on public platform. During the campaign it is hoped to encourage cigarette

smokers to quit, and to discourage non-smokers from starting the habit.

Dr. C. W. M. Service is chairman of the project; E. Freeborn is secretary, and Mrs. A. E. Hick is program co-ordinator. The project has general support throughout the community, with Mayor John Eakins serving as honorary chairman, and representatives of the ministerial association and school teachers working with the medical profession and the voluntary health organizations.
