Canada's hope for Olympic medal

PICKERING TWP.—Beverley Boys, the 16-year-old diving sensation from Pickering Township, is one of Canada's top hopes for a medal at the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico.

It is the chief aim of the blonde mite, who saw her first-place lead wiped out by officials in her first big

competition—the 1966 British Empire Games in Jamaica.

She led the entire field by 15 points after the preliminary round, but the English and Australian teams protested that wind throughout the round had caused bad dives from the 10-metre board.

The Games committee

upheld the protest and the preliminaries were rerun, with Miss Boys finishing 12 points behind the leader.

She finished with a silver medal in the three-metre event and a bronze in the 10 metres.

Her comeback after the protest is the measure of the young competitor's temperament.

Miss Boys is the reigning Canadian champion, although her selection to the team for the 1968 Olympics still depends on her performance in the national trials this summer.

Miss Boys is currently practising each dive 10 to 15 times daily. Nothing less will do for the Olympics.


The C.G.I.T. entertained their mothers, the Explorers and their mothers, and friends in the Sunday
