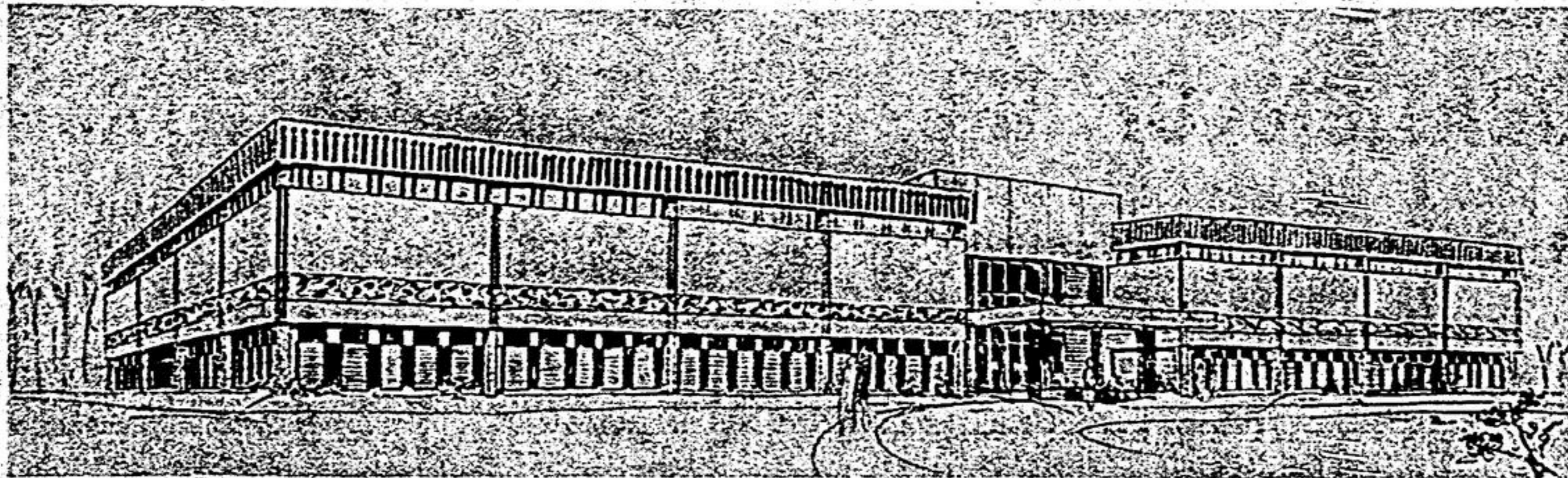


### Three-vehicle crash

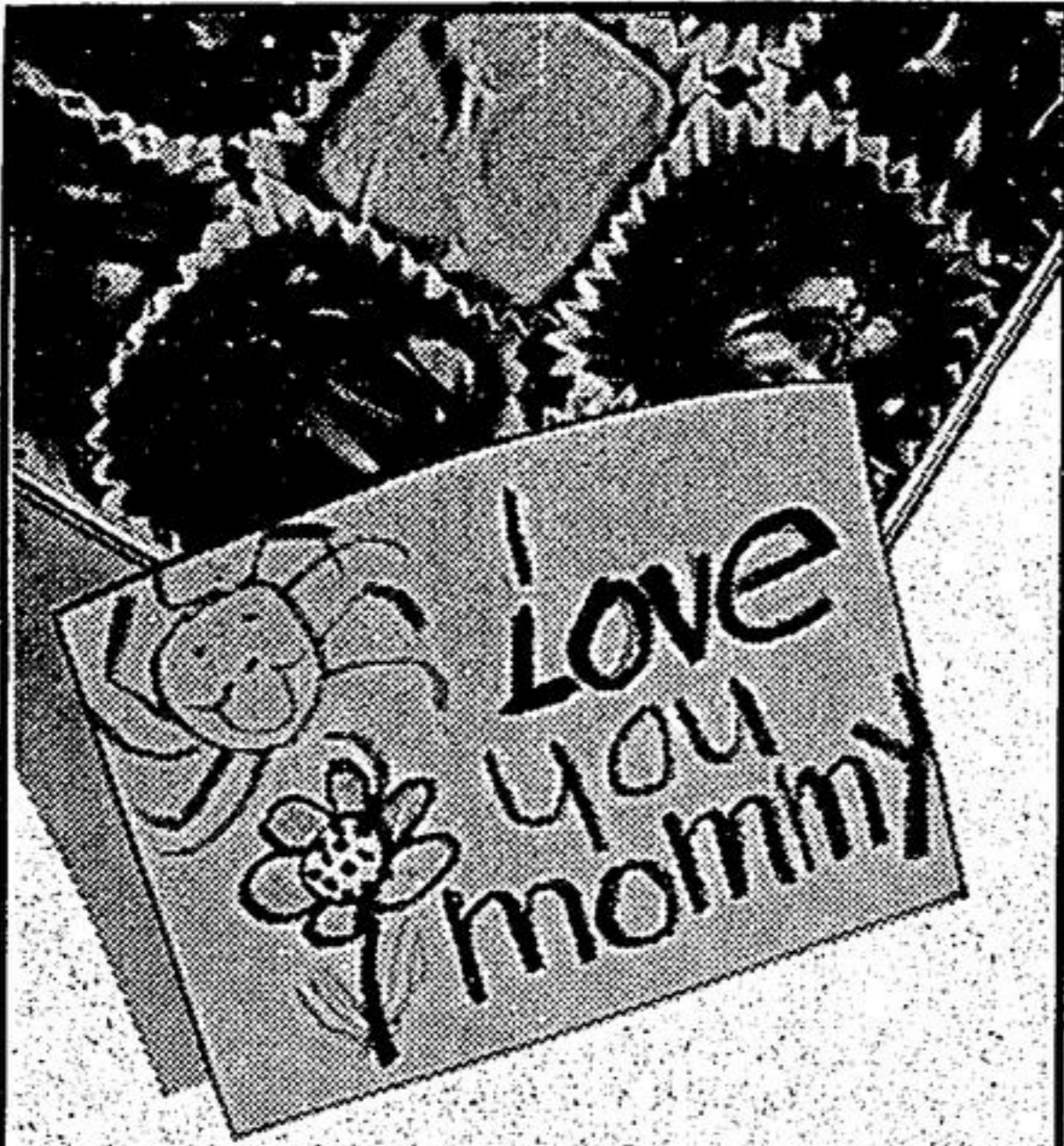

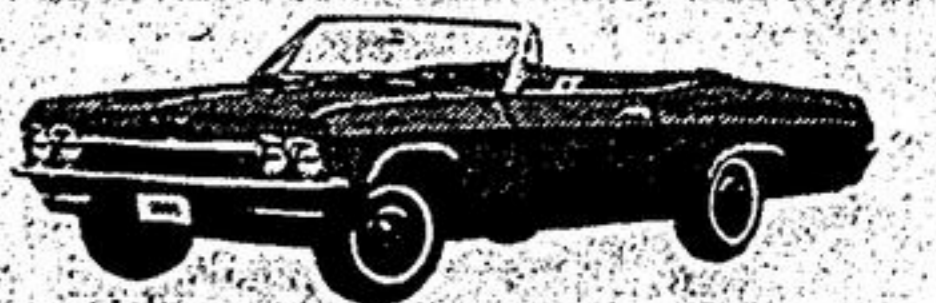
