

Fourteen records broken at Stouffville school meet

Cliff Bass sr. champ

STOUFFVILLE — It was truly a "field day" for student track and field stars at the Stouffville Dist. Secondary School meet, Monday. A total of 14 records were broken.

Cliff Bass led the onslaught against the stop watch with records in the Senior 440-880 and 1 mile. Derek Gresham came up with a brilliant performance in Intermediate class, breaking records in the 100 and 880 yards. Peter Sanderson, also an Intermediate, set new marks in the triple jump and 1 mile.

In the Senior division, Ken Coutts set records in the shot-put and discus. Keith Liedtke, a Junior, broke the existing marks in the 220 and 440 while Glen Gibson snapped the distance for the discus and tied the Junior 100.

Other record holders are: Mike Bridges, Intermediate 220; Andreas Blackwell, Intermediate 440 and Terry Ratcliff, senior high jump (tie).

The following are class champions for 1968: BOYS — Eighteen year old Clifford Bass of Grade 13, is the Senior title holder with 18 points. The runner-up was Kenneth Coutts with 16. The Intermediate champion is 17 year old Mike Bridges of Grade 12. He counted 14 points. Close on his heels was Derek Gresham with 13. The Junior champion is Glen Gibson with 17 points. Only one point back with 16 was Keith Liedtke.

For the GIRLS, the champions are Lorna Burns (senior); Sue Jones (intermediate) and Frances Smith (junior). Frances scored with 4 firsts while Sue and Lorna each had 3 firsts and 1 second.

The Stouffville Dist. Secondary entry of Mike Bridges, Andreas Blackwell, Stewart Smith and Derek Gresham, captured first place in the Junior "A" division of the Cornelius Relay Carnival. The foursome set a new record of 3:47.7 for 1 mile.

Derek set the pace with a brilliant half-mile in 1:59.7, his best mark ever. Andreas covered the one-quarter mile in 53.5 seconds.

In addition to four individual plaques, a large trophy will be retained by the school.

The meet, started in 1953, attracted a total of 50 entries. In "A" class, besides Stouffville were: Barrie, Caledonia, Cayuga, Waterdown, Saltfleet, Ridley College, Highland Secondary School and Henry Street High School.

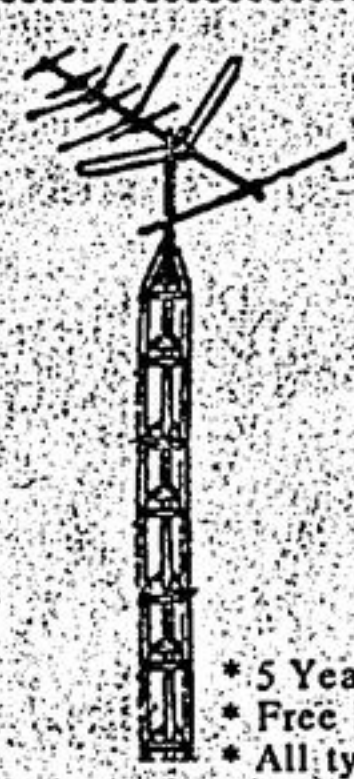
